
210-Player Field Jeff Raynes National Open Champ

Jeff Raynes, a Grand Master from nearby Cary, NC came home the winner at the year-ending 32nd National Open, played in Raleigh, NC. Raynes had to win the hard way, as he went to the loser's bracket after three rounds, and fought his way to the championshp with 11 consecutive wins. Life Master Peter Setian (MA) came close, but lost his last two matches to Raynes and finished 2nd. Life Master Jeff Shimp (MI) and Master Ken Patenaude (MA) finished 3-4 in this 210-player event.

A whopping 142 peggers played the Consolation, and it was old pro Bill Campbell (FL) taking home the marbles. Campbell has been a fixture at this event for many years and finally hit paydirt. Local John Morch took 2nd, followed by Master Joy Shimp (MI) and Life Master Ray Boesel (WI) in the 3-4 bracket. Ron LaPointe (FL) had the hot hand in the Q round, scoring a nice 17 GP card.

Director Catherine Perkins reported the satellite Early Bird kickoff had a rarity...Sal Scolaro (MA) scored a 29-hand INTHE CRIB! But it was Life Master Charley Finley (CT) winning the event. Larry Gould (NC) won the Saturday Special, and the Loser's

Losers was copped by Grand Master Marlene Lazachek (WI). Master Lindsey Peever (FL) took the Last Roundup win, and the High Roller saw Two-Star Warren Sondericker come home the winner.



Life Master Don Flesch (WI) scored the 13th (and last) 29-hand of the 2006 season, and took home \$100 from the ACC for this gem. Charley Finley, Bob McCabe, Jim Hartley, and Sal Scolaro scored 28-hands.

Director Perkins reported that several media writers were on hand reporting this event, and that she was pleased with the increased attendance from last year. This event continues to be one of the best the ACC has to offer. Mark your calendars for National Open number 33 next year.

Marty Symons Tops Portland

The event is named the Portland Summer Open, but it is played across the Columbia River in Vancouver, WA. Nevertheless, being north of the Columbia did NOT faze Master Marty Symons (OR) as he zipped to the championship in this 146-player event. The win rewarded Symons 196 MRP's and he wound down the 2006 cribbage year in style. Life Master John Furler (OR) very nearly earned an All-American award, but fell just short (1,066, needing 1,129) with a 2nd place finish. Monica Newton (OR) and Master Bud Ferrigno (OR) finished 3-4, and earned 105 MRP's each. Life Master Cres Fernandez (CA) topped the Q round with a very nice 37 16/22 +233 card.

Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) closed down the cribbage year on a hot note, winning the 106-player Consolation. One of her house guests for the weekend was Life Master Harvey Honeycutt (OR), and luck would have it, he was her last opponent in the playoffs. She proved to not be a hospitable host as she left him in 2nd place. Master Bill O'Malley (OR) and Dana Machado (OR) finished 3-4. Grand Master Jason Shumate (OR) took Q honors with a 17 8/9 +164 card.

Mike Burns Cops Granite City Classic

Grand Master Mike Burns may have trouble signing up players for next year's action as he directed the Granite City Classic, St. Cloud, MN...and proceeded to take the qualifying round action (37 15/22 +326) and the playoffs as well. And his co-director, Master Doug Munneke finished 2nd! Both Burns and Munneke are from St. Cloud. The win in this 58-player event rewarded Burns with 162 MRP's (aggregate), and Munneke garnered 70 for his 2nd place finish. Life Master Frank Trojan (MN) and Don Chmielewski (MN) finished 3-4 and took home 42 MRP's each.

Locals took home the sanctioned action as well as Jason Hill won the 28-player Consolation, besting Thomas Winter (MN) in the final playoff match. Master Richard Neunsinger (MN) and Elizabeth Miller (MN) finished 3-4. Miller took the Q action as well (15 7 +160).

Director Burns reported Dennis McNurlin won the Friday night event, and Kevin Post copped the Saturday night action. And who won the All-Events? None other than Mike Burns!

For two short days Ed Weiplep, Spokane, WA was leading the nation in the 2007 Master Point Race. The 2007 season began on August 1, and on Friday, August 4, Weilep came home the winner at the Sunnyside (WA) Mid-Week Classic. In besting the 38 players, Weilep took home 105 MRP's...and the national MRP lead. Master Nancy Lorenz (OR) finished 2nd, followed by Grand Master Jerry Hahn (OR) and 2006 All-American Todd Malmgren (OR) in the 3-4 slot. Lorenz also took Q honors with a 32 15/22 +188 card. Qualifying scores were very low as the field was evenly matched. Two 26-GP cards made the playoffs, and Grand Master Willie Evans (WA) scored 5 MRP's with a 27 GP card...a score earning MRP's more than likely never to be repeated.

Frank Bayne (WA) won the 36-player Consolation, with Candaian Egon Koch taking home 2nd. Grand Master George Mackie (WA) and Alaskan Arlene Carle finishing 3-4. One-Star Roy Hofbauer took Q honors with a 16 7/9 +149 card.

And to top that, he also earned his Master rating. With a nice crowd of 120 peggers, Hardy took home 147 MRP's and earned Master with points to burn. Life Master Charlie Rapoza (MA) gave Hardy a run for the money, but settled for 2nd (and 105 MRP's), Dottie Vandenberghe (MA) very nearly had a grand slam in the Q round, missing a single game by 2 points, but her 23 11/12 +179 easily took honors. And she finished in the 3-4 bracket in the playoffs as well. Master Jack Marani (MA) also finished in the 3-4 bracket...and earned 70 MRP's.

Rule of the month review —The Play: A single card that is released by the fingers is considered played, whether or not the count is announced, and may be retrieved only if it would cause the count to exceed 31.

Signing your opponent's scorecard: After you complete your game you sign off your opponent's scorecard. Signing their card means that you have verified the entry as being correct. This is very important because if the entries do not match, it causes your club statistician a lot of work to find and correct the error prior to entering the data into the Grass Roots website.

2,477 Three-Peat!

Three-Peat! Duane Toll Sets Record MRP Score

Three Star Duane Toll, Sutherlin, OR had a cribbage year to remember as he rolled to his third consecutive National Championship, breaking his old record score of 2,473. He scored 2,477 in the 2006 cribbage year, upping the mark by four Master Rating Points. This is Toll's fourth title, as he won in 1987, but the last three years have been eye-popping runs for the title. He began this cribbage year on a torrid pace, and with but six month's play in the bag, his nearest competitors were far, far behind and the race from that point on was a virtual moot point.

Only Ron Morgan, a One-Star player from Loytalton, CA stood a slim chance of catching the streaking Toll. Morgan won the July Reno event to cement a 2nd place finish (1,777 MRP's). Two-time National Champion Jim Langley, a One-Star player from Red Bluff, CA, had a steady year, complete with a strong finish to take home the third spot on the All-American Team. Master Dan Marsh, Eugene, OR played with gusto the entire year, as he raced from event to event on his trusty motorcycle and nailed down over 1,400 MRP's to complete an outstanding year of pegging. Another Master pegger...Bob Bartosh, Sacramento, CA...travelled far and wide in a dedicated drive for MRP's and it paid off with a 5th place finish (1,281). Both Marsh and Bartosh earned their first All-American Team award. Jim Crawford, Mountain View, CA, earned his Life Master during the 2006 campaign and zipped to his 3rd consecutive All-American honor. He very nearly won the National title in 2005 by winning Grand National XXIII (Atlanta) and the JPW/ACC Open in the same year. The odds of that happening again are very remote, indeed.

Master Erik Locke, Portland, OR earned his first All-American team berth by posting a great 1,173 MRP's. Locke is blessed with a very quick (and accurate) mind and can hold his own with the best. Two-Star Warren Sondericker, Milwaukee, WI nailed down his 5th All-American team honor, as this veteran pegger continues his fine play, beginning in the early 1980's. Two Life Masters round out the top ten...Todd Malmgren, Clackamas, OR and Richard Frost, Berlin, WI. Both peggers are nearing their One-Star ratings and had excellent seasons.






