All American Preview

With the 2007–2008 season two-thirds over, Grand Master Erik Royland Locke (Portland OR) seems to have a hammer lock on the national championship. Winner of five tournaments this year, Erik has racked up an impressive 1,707 MRPs. He has a good shot at breaking the record of 2,477 MRPs set by Life Master ($\star \star \star$) Duane Toll (Sutherlin OR) in 2005–2006. The only question now is, will he exceed the 3,000-MRP mark?

I love numbers and statistics, as a casual perusal of almost any *Cribbage World* issue shows. Numbers reveal trends (where the market is heading or who's been hot lately) and provide a reason for behavior (why you should wear your seat belt or throw 2-3 into your own crib).

My Deal

But stats—numbers—are meaningless without context. Knowing, for example, that a creek has an average depth of six inches provides little comfort when you're going down for the third time.

And what might a particular stat *not* be telling you? Aaron Levenstein, longtime business professor at Baruch College, perhaps said it best: "Statistics are like bikinis. What they reveal is suggestive, but what they conceal is vital."

Stats can also be absurd—to the extent of "so what? who cares?"—as illustrated in humorist Des McHale's quirky observation: "The average human has one breast and one testicle."

Finally, stats are only as reliable as their source (remember the old joke: 72% of all statistics are made up on the spot).

With these caveats in place, let me introduce—and provide the rationale for—this issue's "Stat of the Month," which lists the MRPs, GRPs, and IRPs earned by each current BOD member on page 13 below.

Since they were extracted from the official ACC database, I can assure you that these stats are reliable (MRPs and IRPs were verified at cribbage.org; GRPs at accgrassroots.org). And while some of you may rightly find them meaningless, I can equally assure you that these stats do not tell everything about these twenty-five individuals.

No person can be summed up in a number (the view of the Social Security Administration not withstanding). The value of each human is more than a line of digits in a ledger.

So why, then, are these numbers important? In one sense, of course, they aren't. Compared to the important things in life—family, friends, flossing daily they're just an interesting (or boring) component of a game. But they do show trends or emphases.

Like our membership at large, some BOD members play in only weekend tournaments, while others focus on Grass Roots or internet play. But just as it takes three flavors to make Neapolitan ice cream, so it takes people with diverse interests and abilities to make the BOD—and the ACC itself—a vital organization.

One reason that sports radio is so popular is that sports statistics provide fodder for endless discussion and arguments. I therefore present these stats this month just because they caught my eye. They're intriguing and give us food for thought. So glance them over, start a friendly argument with your buddy about what they mean, and see where you fit into the mix.

First Deal

Since there is an advantage to deal first in a game, alternate deal is used in many tournaments (including the TOC), so that this advantage is equally and fairly distributed. I have suggested to BOD member David Campbell that in playoffs the right of first deal should not be decided by chance, but by the relative standings in the qualifying round. In each round the player with the higher standing would be the dealer of the first game (with the possible exception of the final round). This procedure has a precedent in just about any sport where playoffs occur-baseball, basketball, football, and so on. The home field advantage goes to the team with the best record in the regular season. They earned it, they deserved it. Let it be so in cribbage.



Support for Veterans



Is That Really a Q-Pool?

When is a Q-pool not a Q-pool? When you enter it and qualify but don't get any money from it. I don't have a problem with a pool which pays only to the top 1/8 of the players. Just don't call it a qualifying pool. A high card pool, big winners pool—anything but implying that if you enter this pool and qualify you will win money. To tournament directors who offer Q-pools which don't pay off to every entrant who qualifies: please consider changing the name of your pool to avoid confusion. If you still feel that tradition is on your side, then make it crystal clear in the tournament literature that this pool is not really what its title implies.



Everything You've Always Wanted to Know about Cribbage (But Were Afraid to Ask)

One of the more common questions CW receives is this: Why aren't my Grass Roots points listed in Cribbage World?

To understand what is involved in this process, it is important to know what hap-

Once the regional snafus are worked out, the national statistician must pull the numbers from the database and post them to each person's account. Again, problems with ACC and Grass Roots membership can

from the moment you get them in club to the time they show up in *Cribbage World*.

First, the club director or statistician must record the results of each weekly tournament on the Grass Roots website. This means entering each person's score and making sure that the totals balances (i.e., positive points must equal negative points, except in the case of byes).

The four regional statisticians (each is responsible for approximately fifty clubs) must then post the results of every club tournament by opening the database for each tournament and checking it. Sounds simple enough, but the results of a tournament can be posted only if *all* players in the tournament have paid their ACC dues, have an ACC number, and have paid the Grass Roots dues. If even one club member hasn't done one of these things, then the results of the entire tourney have to await resolution of this problem. process. Only after all of this happens can a list be generated for the top players in each Grass Roots division, which the national statistician sends to CW.

As should be obvious, even a modest delay of a week at each step could result in GRPs not being posted for up to three months after they earned—and this is if everything goes without a hitch. Let one member fail to send in their ACC membership application (or let it lapse), or let one club statistician forget to mail the Grass Roots registration form, and the results cascade down the line.

Also remember that all these statisticians—local, regional, and national—are volunteers. They all have lives outside of cribbage, and family or other emergencies take priority over GRPs.

So next time you wonder what happened to your GRPs, rest assured that they are somewhere in the statistical pipeline and that will be posted eventually.



Rule of the Month-Recording scores on the board

Beginning with the outside track, a player shall record his or her first score by placing a peg in the hole corresponding to their score. 



Showing obvious concern about the prevalence of performance-enhancing drugs in other big league sports, the ACC's Board of Directors voted unanimously at their February meeting in Reno to institute random drug testing of TOC participants.

While acknowledging that there have been no confirmed reports of the use of peg-enhancing drugs at any ACC-sanctioned tournament, **Martha "The Drug Czar" Fingleton** sponsored the proposal in order to make sure that cribbage remains free of cribbatonic substances. Fingleton singled out Pegitol, Skunkadone, Gozac, and the black market drug known as Mypegsrbig as being potentially troublesome on the cribbage circuit.

BOD fellow member **Dan Zeisler**, who heads up the ACC's youth program, seconded the proposal and asked that the program also include an emphasis for junior members: "Just say go!"

In addition to preventing cheating, testing for hallucinacribbic drugs will also provide another peg in the fight against ICD, or irrational cribbage depression. The roots of this malady go all the way back to **Sir John Suckling**, the unhappy poet who invented cribbage and then took poison to end his life after he lost a game in the stink hole.

The first test of the new policy will come next February, when an expected 600 of the ACC's top players descend once again on Reno to determine the champion of champions. If this trial program operates smoothly, the program will be immediately expanded to all sanctioned tournaments, beginning with the midweek Topaz

tourney in February 2009.

More details will be released in future months, but in the meantime here are the instructions that the BOD put in place for the 2009 TOC:

- To insure that no foreign antibodies influence the testing, all TOC participants are asked to refrain from eating, drinking, or sleeping within twelve hours of the start of play.
- During the third game of the TOC, a list of randomly chosen names will be announced over the PA system. If your name is called, please report immediately to the bathrooms on the second floor of the hotel.
- You must use one of the standard cups supplied by the ACC; no custom cups are allowed.
- When you are finished, place the lid securely on the cup and take it to the judges' desk in the main playing room.
- Wash hands before resuming play.

Results of the drug tests will be announced by 3:00 on Friday afternoon. A positive drug test will result in a ten-point penaltyagainstanyapparentqualifier. Comments or questions may be addressed to Martha at drugczar@cribbage.net.
