My Deal



Random notes from my Reno trip.

It's not everyday that you get to play cribbage with more than twice as many people as lived in your childhood hometown. A total of 2,530 players entered the four Reno events; about 1,000 people lived in East Wenatchee WA when I was growing up.

As I left my current home in Grand Rapids MI, I was happy I wasn't heading east. Unfortunately, the snowstorm that struck the Atlantic seaboard delayed or forced many cribbage players to change or cancel their travel plans. I hope I'll get to see my snowbound friends soon.

As much as I enjoyed seeing all my cribbage-playing friends from elsewhere around the continent, the absence of Joe Bernard, Bob Madsen, Bob McCabe, and George Bickford in Reno was both poignant and noticeable.

I found out how to have a decent afternoon of cribbage: have a crappy morning! I won only three games before lunch on Saturday. And then—when it no longer mattered—I began winning in the late afternoon.

Central Region players captured three of four Reno events, plus the All Star Tournament on Thursday.

We nearly had a husband-wife matchup in semifinals. Life Master/Second Fiddle Mike McDaniel (Springfield OR) made the quarterfinals, but apparently couldn't bear to face wife Winona in the final four. Winona had a great two-day run: she qualified #2 in the main with a 41/19 +321 scorecard and finished #2. Look for her to become the first female to break the cribbage glass barrier and win the ACC Open.

Rick Westerman (Wenatchee WA) again did yeoman's work in recording the Reno weekend in pictures. All photos in this issue are provided courtesy of Rick.





Tournament Tidbits

Pacific Coast Championship In the consolation playoffs, Life Master (★) Jones Hom (Fairfield CA) and Grand Master Rickie Mack (McKinleyville CA) didn't notice anything wrong with their deck of cards until the third deal, when Jones was dealt a pair of 9 of Diamonds. It turns out that they were playing with a pinochle deck, which had no low cards (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8) and two copies of everything else (A, 9, 10, J, Q, K)—for a total of 48 cards. In true sporting fashion, they agreed to start the game over. Moral: always check the deck of cards, at minimum counting them to make sure there are 52.

St. Croix Classic After a five-year break, the Turtle Lake tourney picked up right where it left off: huge attendance (256 players), lots of excitement (eight 28-hands, one grand slam), awesome casino perks (\$13,528 added in perks and prize money), and a repeat champion. Grand Master Dan Pluff (Saint Paul MN) claimed his second main championship (along with one consolation win). The next St. Croix Classic will be held on June 18–20.

Life Master (**) Wayne Steinmetz (Milwaukee WI) won the ACC Challenge by posting the best cumulative score in three ACC-sponsored events: 31/15 +137 in Grand National, 24/10 +191 in the TOC, and 32/14 +265 in the ACC Open—for a combined 87/39 +593.



Club 54 (4th Street Terrorists in Antioch CA) swept the high qualifier slots in the two biggies: Basil Rudnick (Isleton CA) beat out 857 other players in the ACC Open main with a 42/20 +378 scorecard, and Paul Gregson (Antioch CA) topped the TOC field with a 28/13 +202 scorecard. Gregson very nearly did it again in the consolation, when he turned in a grand slam 19/9 +161. Unfortunately (for Paul), Roger Widdowson (Westminster CO) turned in a 21/8 +243 after getting skunks in games 2, 4, 5, 7, and 9!

By winning the ACC Open main and finishing in 33rd place in the TOC, Life Master Erik Royland Locke (Portland OR) obviously had the best combined finish in these two events. Three other players also finished well in both TOC ACC Open main tourneys: 9th 33rd Sandra Stroup (Elgin IL) 33rd DeLynn Colvert (Missoula MT) 17th 17th

Central Region All Star

The Central Region, led by Captain Wayne Steinmetz, captured the 20th annual All Star Competition, played in Reno on Thursday evening before the TOC and JPW/ACC Open.

In contrast to last year, when the Western team squeaked out a single-point victory, this year's tourney was a blowout. The Central Region's 157/75 easily topped the two opposing teams. The Western Region, led by Life Master (***) Duane Toll (Sutherlin OR), scored 124/59; while the Eastern Region, led by Life Master Larry Phifer (Raleigh NC), scored 121/58.


Centralia Club 232, winner of twenty-six tournaments, Club 232 champion seven times, and much more.

Youth Teaching Tip

Here's a great tip for teaching kids: keep a poker face at all times! Anyone who has taught kids cribbage knows exactly what I mean. They clearly broadcast their like or dislike of the cut card each and every time it is turned over. When I am playing one of my students and they grumble when a queen is cut, I immediately thank them for letting me know that they don't have a hand heavy on face cards, or cards that add up to five. This is a gentle way of letting them know that their antics are actually feeding information about their hand to a savvy opponent. I also explain to them how they can use it to their advantage when playing against an opponent who shares his or her emotions about the cut card.

Many identical board game boxes were made for other companies, and they carried that company's name on the box. The open game box in this photo was labeled "Victory Manufacturing Corp. Chicago, Ill. (Model No. 2008)." Springfield Greene Industries ceased operation in 1988.
