## **Top 100 Survey**

ruth be told, many of us are downright jealous of players who consistently make the All American team, win multiple tournaments each year, earn 1,000 MRPs every season, and seemingly cash and/or qualify in every tourney they enter.

The little green jealousy monster inside us says: "If I got those kind of cards, I too could win that often." Or, "The only reason so-and-so wins is because he/she is so lucky."

But is it *only* luck that propels these players to the top of the leader board each season? Might something else lie behind their success?

To find out the answer to this perplexing problem, CW surveyed the top 100 players in the 2009–2010 season to learn how they win on a consistent basis. A phenomenal 96% of the players responded to the survey.

Each player was asked: "Which skills are most valuable to you in winning games and qualifying at tournaments?" From the following list, they chose their top three attributes and rated them 1-2-3 (with "1" being highest):

- discarding to opponent's crib
- · discarding to your crib
- endgame strategy
- having first deal
- identifying opponent's hand
- intimidation/psychological factors



# My Deal



I make my living with words. I work with them every day, shaping strings of them into just the right shape, throwing out some, adding in others, to make coherent thoughts, sentences, paragraphs.

This is undoubtedly an occupational hazard, but it just makes sense to me that words should be used accurately, that they should be spelled correctly, that the right word should be used the right way and in the right place, and that one should say exactly what one means.

CW doesn't always live up to these standards (which I conveniently blame on the pressure to get each monthly issue to the printer on time), but I keep trying.

Regardless, I've got a few pet peeves regarding cribbage terminology. Not with the terms themselves, but with how players misuse certain terms when perfectly good words exist for what they really mean to say. Here's my list of mangled malaprops.


pone—this is not a synonym for "opponent"; it means the *nondealer* on any particular deal. The misuse of this term is especially grating when someone says something like this: "I threw a pair of 3s into the pone's crib"—which may be the best cribbage oxymoron I've ever heard.

partner—the person sitting across the table from you is *not* your partner; he or she is your opponent. If you're unclear on the difference, ask for a share of their prize money.

nobs—this does not mean a cut Jack; it means having a Jack in your hand that matches the suit of the starter card. A dealer cannot cut nobs from one or two holes out to win the game. The dealer may very well turn over a Jack and win the game, but this is called "His Heels," sometimes "nibs," but never "nobs."

muggins—muggins applies only to points that I miss that you are entitled to take—and then only in tournaments where muggins is in effect (like all those in North Carolina). If I overpeg and you back me up to the correct hole, that is not muggins. It is stupidity on my part, but you simply are claiming penalty points according to rule 8.4c, not mugging me. Bonus gripe: the noun is "muggins," not "muggings."

The ACC rulebook includes a statement that abusive language is grounds for suspension or expulsion. I don't suppose I'll ever be able to convince the Ethics Committee to include mangled words in this statement!

Given the importance of this topic for the future of the ACC, this month's entire "Your Deal" column is given over to the following letter from **Keith Widener** (Clemmons NC).

The December CW contained two letters expressing concerns about minors playing in sanctioned tournaments and winning money. I completely disagree with them.

I believe that the intent of the ACC's founding fathers was to do whatever we can to encourage and promote cribbage at all levels. The National Open in Raleigh—where the ACC was founded and incorporated—has always been open to minors. It was blessed from the beginning by the North Carolina State Attorney General—in a very conservative state that didn't even have a lottery at that time.

In my opinion, cribbage—and the winning of prize money—is not gambling. Look at the Reno tournament. If you win more then \$1,200, the Sands Regency gives you a 1099 form and reports it as prize winnings—not gambling winnings. If you hit a slot machine, you get a W-2G, which reports gambling winnings and withholds taxes. More than anyone, Nevada knows what gambling is and is not.

Minors have won money in numerous other events. For example, a thirteen-year-old boy in Louisiana won \$20,000 a few years ago in a national scrabble tournament, and recently a fourteen-year-old girl in New York won \$10,000 in a national texting contest. Another young teen won

several million in the Georgia lottery! How? Minors cannot purchase lottery tickets, but they can possess them and win money. That is true in most states.

Concerns that some people have with regard to age, money, and alcohol can easily be handled by requiring a parent or guardian to sign a consent form allowing their son or daughter to play, and tournament directors can give prize money won by the minor to the parent. With regard to alcohol, many tournaments don't allow alcohol in the playing room. But even if they do, we rent our rooms for a private function. Other private functions—such as weddings and Christmas parties—serve alcohol with minors present. If this is such a problem, how do they do it?

We need to quit sounding the alarm when there is no alarm to sound. We need to be finding ways to make things work out instead of reacting with fear. If we want the ACC to last beyond our lifetimes, then closed minds need to be opened. Our youth represents the future. We need them.

Keith is the father of Zachary, who earned his first MRPs when he was ten years old and won his first sanctioned tournament two years later. At age thirteen he became the youngest player ever to qualify and win money at the National Open. At the 2006 Atlanta Classic, Zach was high qualifier in both the main and consolation and defeated the late Bobby Stuart in the consy finals.

The most amazing—but entirely expected—finding that the survey shows is

the value that the top players place on playing board position. This skill was rated #1 by 49 of the 96 respondents (51%), #2 by 15 respondents (15.6%), and #3 by 5 respondents (5.2%). Only 27 players (28.1%) did not include it in their top three.

Pegging was the second-place vote

getter, with 55 total votes; and playing the odds was third with 40 votes. The two discarding varieties—to the opponent's crib and to your crib—rounded out the top five choices, with 46 votes between them. Items listed under "other" ranged from the expected (luck, aggressiveness, instincts) to the frivolous (divine intervention).

Together, the top three skills collected a majority of the votes (164)—with the remaining ten skills garnering only 122 votes. And the top five skills polled 210 votes, or 73.4% of the total votes cast.

Generally, the higher a player was ranked in the top 100, the more importance he or she placed on both of the top

> two choices. For example, eight of the top ten players rated playing board position as #1. And of these eight players, seven of them listed pegging as #2.

> These findings show that the top players rose to the top by developing the skills that win games—playing board position,

pegging skillfully, playing the odds, discarding wisely—not by luck or some other random factor that can't be controlled.

And this is good news for the rest of us. By diligent application of the same skills available to the top 100 players, we too can improve our game, increase our win continued on next page

The results of the November poll are in, and by a 41-23 margin the majority of poll respondents prefer that the ACC and Grass Roots organizations maintain separate membership fees.

But this also means that a sizeable minority (36%) would like both fees to be combined into a single annual payment.

Most voters for each view—that is, 37 of 41 votes for the majority viewpoint, and 21 of 23 votes for the minority—play both ACC tournaments and Grass Roots cribbage. The voting was thus not influenced by members who play only one or the oth-

er of these venues.

There was no regional bias in favor of either position.

# Youth Teaching Tip

When you work to teach kids how to play cribbage, please do not incorporate muggins into your lesson plans. Some students will inevitably learn how to play quicker than others, and

the last thing you want to do to those taking a bit longer to catch on is to set them up to feel like a failure when they miss points. In fact, when I teach the game in the very beginning, I encourage students to help those who miss points and allow them to still take the points they may have missed. Once there is some mastery of the game, I then tell students to gently acknowledge when their opponent misses points, but not allow them to take them. Remember, it is crucial to build an early foundation of joy for the game of cribbage in kids. Muggins, in this instance, is counterproductive.





The starter card was a 9, and so Wayne has only 6 points—one point short! Paul counts his 7-hand and then flops the crib to find that both players discarded 7-8, which gave him a 24-crib on the last hand of the night! submitted by Paul Hirschman

While holding 5-10-Q-K gives Wayne 6 of the 7 points he needs to win the game, only sixteen cuts get him the win (three 5s and thirteen face cards). Holding 5-7-8-10, however, gives him twenty great cuts (three each of 5, 7, 8, 10 and four each of 6, 9) and eighteen pretty good cuts (four each of 2, 3, J and three each of Q, K). "Crib Pointers" in the December Cribbage World (pages 20-21) shows how to figure out which hand to hold in order to increase your odds of going out. -DG & DA
