he Elk's Lodge in Reidsville NC is the home of Reidsville Cribbage Club 102. When the clubroom was remodeled twenty-five years ago, Club 102 installed a "cribbage island."

Conceived, designed, and supervised by **Jack Grogan** and **Henry Douglass**, the cribbage island has five mahogany cribbage boards inlaid in a mahogany bar twelve feet long, two feet wide, and three inches thick. On the wall is a list of club champions and the ten perfect hands



that have been played by Club 102 members. The bar is used daily for cribbage and as a gathering spot. Many visitors have admired the bar, and all have said that they have never seen another like it anywhere.

My Deal



ACC President Jeanne Hofbauer's column this month deals with the issue of all ten members of the All American team coming from the same region. For years now, the Western Region has claimed a majority of slots on the All American team, but this is the first time in ACC history that all ten All Americans have come from the same region.

Unlike Jeanne, I think there is a problem. I'm not sure how big it is, nor am I certain as to what the best solution would be. In addition, I don't think that the problem surfaced only this year, when all ten All American members came from the Western Region. Wasn't it just as much of an issue when eight All Americans lived out west, as in 2008 and 2009, or nine, as in 2007? Why is it suddenly a problem when the number hits 100%?


As a member of the Board of Directors, I've sat in on several discussions about this topic, and by time you read this there will likely have been another squabble over it at the BOD meeting in Reno in late September.

Several solutions have been proposed for this dilemma:

- Leave as is: proponents of this view (see Jeanne's column) say that the present system is based on the exercise of personal choices—to attend or not attend more tournaments—so leave well enough alone.
- Count toward the All American award only certain tournaments—perhaps those designated by the BOD or sim-

- ply, say, the first X number of tourneys that a player attends. Since this stricture runs contrary to the main purpose of the ACC—to encourage people to play cribbage—it needs careful scrutiny.
- The top X number of players (perhaps three or four or five) from each region are the All Americans, regardless of their overall national ranking. This proposal has the advantage of encouraging competition within each region—making three mini-contests instead of only one large one.
- Count toward the All American award only those MRPs earned in a player's home region. This year's Top Ten earned a total of 18,329 MRPs—but only 523 of these points, or 2.85%, were earned *outside* the Western Region. Since this proposal basically gives the same results as the current system, maybe it should be turned on its head: count only half of the MRPs earned in a player's home region, with the additional requirement that an All American must play X number of tournaments outside his/her home region.

High Qualifier—Twice?

Has anyone ever been high qualifier in the main, lost in the first round, and then been high qualifier in the consolation?

Keith Miller (Waynesville NC)

CW response: This has likely happened multiple times, but CW knows of only one. At the April 2008 Milwaukee Challenge, Life Master (★) Jim Crawford (Mountain View CA) was high qualifier in the main with 37 points. After a first-round bye, Jim was eliminated in the second round and entered the consolation, where he was again high qualifier, this time with a grand slam 19-point scorecard! But—alas—he was again eliminated in the first round he played.

Declining Attendance, Increasing Skill

Many people play cribbage in New England, yet so few play in tournaments or, for that matter, know of the ACC. In tournaments I play in, I usually know 90% of the people well enough to say hello by first name. If we get a couple of new players, it's a good tournament. I joined the ACC a few years ago because my good friend and neighbor was ambitious about recruiting members. At that time several New Englanders ran big tournaments and went out of their way to recruit players. Joe Seigle, Al Miller, George Bickford, Rit Alkas, Joe Ramos, and John Chambers would run tourneys where attendance often topped 150 participants. There was a huge tournament at the old Biltmore Hotel in Providence RI that used to draw over 200 players every year. But we now

average less than 90 players in New England, and that number is diminishing. The core group of 60+ who regularly attend New England tournaments is starting to age. In my opinion, however, the skill level of today's players continues to improve. A new player at our last tournament knew how to play, could easily play a game in 15 minutes, and was unanimously welcomed and was helped by his opponents, but managed to win only one game. He did not stay for the consolation, and I doubt we will see him again. An ACC-sanctioned tournament is a tough indoctrination.

• Use batting average to determine the All Americans. The main drawbacks with this proposal are (a) that the ACC's software program is not set up to handle win percentage and (b) that tournament directors would have to report the scores of *everyone* who plays in the main and consolation instead of only the top 25%.

While I am not at all sure that batting average is the best way to determine the All American team, I do think that it is a much better indicator of overall skill than are MRPs. Toward that end, I would like to propose an experiment: a batting average contest in 2012 to see who are the top

players in each region. The rules are listed in the box below.

I've heard positive response to this idea from many players, so it will be fun to see how it plays out over the next year. I look forward to reporting the interim standings throughout the year and announcing the winners in early 2013. And I hope that this contest will provide data that can be used in our ongoing quest to determine the "best cribbage players" in the ACC.

2012 Batting Average Competition

- play as many tournaments as you want between January 1 and December 31, 2012, but you must play a minimum of 200 games to qualify for payback; no refunds will be given to participants who do not complete the 200-game minimum
- only the qualifying rounds of main tourneys count—no playoffs, no consolations, no satellites; note: all games count in the main tourney of the National Open at Raleigh
- all tourneys played in any region count, and all must be reported
- \$20 entry fee, payable to the regional statisticians listed below anytime before
 you play your first tournament; you don't have to sign up before January 1, but
 tournaments played prior to enrollment do not count
- 100% payback to the top four players in each region (40-30-20-10 split); note:
 you are competing against players in only your home region
- skunks do not count extra—only wins and losses count; thus if you turn in a 27/12 scorecard in a 22-game event, you would report 12 wins and 10 losses
- report your win-loss record (subject to verification) in each main qualifying round that you play to the statistician in your region:

Western: Don Brown (dlba@charter.net)

Central: David Aiken (cribbage@iserv.net)

Eastern: Keith Widener (kwidener@triad.rr.com)

 entrants must report their win-loss record—whether high, medium, or low—for each event played; you're on the honor system, so please report every score to your regional statistician within two weeks

cruise, and his favorite tournament is the Veterans Day Classic in Reno. Angelo also enjoys poker, hunting, and camping.


Michigan Long Match

It should be obvious to everyone that cribbage is a game. And a game should be played in a friendly manner. Over the years, *Cribbage World* has printed the occasional letter to the editor about cribbage etiquette or run an article on the same topic.

CW reprints below an article from the December 1982 issue to show how far we've

come. Some of these items are still legitimate, some have long since been incorporated into the ACC rulebook, and some are downright laughable. Here is CW's deconstruction of 1982 etiquette. Remember, it's just a game!

- 1 If this ever made sense, I can't imagine why. Maybe it was an attempt to keep players with a card fetish from fondling the cards in public!
- 2 The 2010 rulebook defines shuffling as "a random mixing of the cards, which could include riffling." And rule 2.1, on "proper mixing" of the cards, states: "The pack must be mixed at least three times with the cards face down or otherwise hidden from both players." Nowhere does the rulebook mention an "over and over shuffle."

Be Nice!

The Etiquette of Cribbage

The Official Rule Book does not specifically cover all situations and very conspicuous by their absence are the unpardonable offenses against the ethics and etiquette of cribbage.

The only way to enforce the unwritten law is to avoid playing with those who constantly indulge in unsportsmanlike acts such as those enumerated herewith. However, in tournaments one must expect to compete against anyone and everyone so, politely call attention to this list.

According to educational standards this may be a negative approach, but the use of "do nots" is the most effective method to describe these situations.

- Do not break the seal on a new deck or handle the cards before your opponent comes to the table.
- Do not fail to follow the riffling of the cards with an over and over shuffle so the final position of any card is not known.
- Do not deal from the bottom packet or a cut deck without first putting the two sections back together.
- Do not cut the pack before your opponent discards to the crib. Do not touch the pack ahead of time.
- Do not reveal the nature of your holding by a remark or gesture.
- Do not hesitate on the play of every card. Some people hesitate and think even though they have only one play to make.

- 3 This is now part of rule
- 3.3b, so it's no longer a matter of etiquette, but of following the rules: "It is not permissible to distribute the cards from a portion of the deck."
- 4 This is also in the rulebook, so it's no longer merely a case of good manners: "Only after both players discard to the crib shall the pack be cut by the pone to determine the starter card" (rule 6.1). And there's that fondling thing again!

- **5** Actually, if you are foolish enough to give away your hand, you probably shouldn't be playing cribbage (or poker or maybe even Uno); in any case, your opponent will be happy for any hints you care to drop.
- 6 "Bluffing" has been part of the game from the get-go. Yes, you shouldn't delay a game by hesitating on every card, but sometimes a slight hesitation

Think Nice. . . .

- Do not detatch a card from your hand before your opponent has made his or her play.
- Do not pull a card from your hand and subsequently play another one. Make up your mind which card you wish to play before reaching for it.
- Do not chatter continuously during the contest as your opponent does not appreciate your meaningless talk. If you must have post mortems after a hand, shuffle the cards while you are talking.
- 10. Do not lay a counted hand on your own side of the board as you proceed to count the crib. Place it face up on your opponent's side.
- 11. Do not reach over the board to pick up an opponent's counted hand or the pack. Ask for it to be placed on your side.
- 12. Do not conclude a match without resetting the pegs and gathering the cards together and leaving the pack in an orderly fashion. Also, be sure to remove your drink glasses.

when you have only one card to play is an acceptable action.

- 7 Say what?
- 8 Again, psychology is a (minor) part of the game and perfectly within the rules.
- Enforcing this rule would likely bar hundreds of players (including your favorite CW editor) from ever playing the game again!
- **10** Fair enough (see rule 9.2d).
- 11 Oops! This former point of etiquette is now completely overturned by the rulebook: "After the pone counts his or her hand and before the dealer begins to count his or her hand, the pone may remove the pack, leaving the starter card in the approximate area where the pack was" (rule 9.3b).
- **12** Makes perfect sense. But if you are a slow play-

er and way behind the players around you, things will move along much more quickly if you leave the housekeeping for the next player.

CW is certainly in agreement with the subtitle of the 1982 article: "Be nice!" But it's probably time for the ACC to update its etiquette guidelines for the 21st century.

The President's Column



The ACC's tournament season runs from August 1 to July 31 each year. So we are just beginning our new season of earning points and awards. But last season unfortunately ended with a small controversy. The problem rests with the All American team.

The All American team consists of the ten ACC players who earned the most Master Rating Points during the season. This year all ten players live within the Western Region. There is some feeling that this is unfair to players in the other regions.

In the past an award called the All Regional Team was given to the top five players from all regions who did not make the All American team. Last September the Board of Directors chose to eliminate this award and initiate a new expanded award called the All Star Award. This new award recognizes those players (sixteen this year) from each region who did not make the All American team.

At this time there is only one way to make the All American team, and that is by earning MRPs. Those players who succeed in doing so have traveled many miles and spent many dollars for that privilege. They are not restrained by our organization in any way from attending as many tournaments of their own choosing as they want.

There have been some ideas for changing the qualifications, however they all have associated problems. How, then, do

we determine who the top ten players will be in an unbiased, unprejudiced, and just manner? I think that our current system already does this. However, if you have a better idea, please contact a board member with it.

I congratulate every person who earned any MRPs this year. Believe me, I know how hard they are to earn! I also think that as long as a person has the time, money, and inclination to travel the tournament trail unbridled, more power to them!

Cribbage Quiz Answer

I'm happy to see that someone reads Cribbage World! The answer to last month's Cribbage Quiz was almost right, but both Jerome Tork (Wisconsin Rapids WI) and Dale Magedanz (Milwaukee WI) pointed out that you can't hold 6-9 and have a zero-point hand. The correct answer should have read like this: "A 0-to-15 improvement by the cut card can happen only in the crib. The crib must contain 4-6-J plus either a 10, Q, or K; all four cards must be in the same suit: and the cut card must be a 5 of the same suit. This yields three 15-2s, a run of three (4-5-6), nobs, and a five-card flush-for a total of 15 points."



August Wrap-Up

This is the start of our eighth full season of ACC internet tournaments. This season we changed from Cribbage Cup to a nine-game Grass Roots type format. Held on each Wednesday, the start time alternates between 8p and 11p ET (5p and 8p PT).



Cribbage Board of the Month

ACC member Kris Kriofske (Rowlett TX) sent me photos of this unique board. Kris plays in the Dallas Grass Roots Club, and he and grandsons Peter Burns and Danny Burns made this board. Granddaughter Megan Burns took the photos. I am sure that this handcrafted cribbage board and its history will be a family treasure for generations to come.

Many of the boards I feature in this column are manufactured, and sometimes their history is difficult to determine. Besides online research. my number one source is Bette Bemis and the Cribbage Board Collectors Society. Bette founded the society and was president for many years. Now president emerita, Bette wrote Cribbage Boards, 1863-1998, the most extensive book on cribbage boards that I know. To read some of her articles about cribbage board collecting, go to cribbage.org, click on "Collector's Corner" in the left column, and then click on "Article Library" in the middle column. Bette's book, along with articles, updates, corrections, and input from other collectors, is a primary source of information for me. So, thanks to Bette and all of my fellow collectors.

To open the NCAA football season, I watched the Michigan/Western Michigan game with one of my oldest friends, Geoff Ujdur, a Michigan Wolverine alum. Geoffrey and I have been playing cribbage a long time—we even have a lifetime count, of which we're just about even—but we'd never ventured far from the traditional game. Last week we decided we'd try something different, so we opened up a game called Crib Wars.

A game of cribbage might last 10–12 minutes. A game of Crib Wars might push two hours. Instead of 121 points to win, you need 363, three times the normal. Depending where you land at various points in the game, there are areas that may slide you ahead twenty points, and others that may drop you back the same. Some penalty zones force you to immediately fold your hand and crib. It may sound wonky, but at one point I trailed by 90 points and came back to win by a margin of six. It may not be for everyone, but it's good for lazy Saturdays and passing the time at the cabin.

If the game itself doesn't interest you, its creator might—Crib Wars comes to us from Norm Ackland, a Canadian cribbage fan and entrepreneur. After learning the story about his game, I learn a little about Norm.

"I'd someday like to write a book on ETAs," he tells me, "Elvis Tribute Artists." When Norm isn't marketing his product, he can often be found on the North Amer-

ican Elvis Tribute Artist circuit. Since the start of this year, he's performed as Midnight Elvis in over 200 shows, crooning the King's later hits. He saw Elvis-twiceand now has one of the largest collections of Elvis paraphernalia in the world. The world of Elvis Tribute Artists and cribbage don't mix much, but he did have this to say: these disparate worlds are both about "setting goals and completing them. It's all about the end-user. You're entertaining people playing the cribbage game, and singing in front of 30,000 people is an awesome experience too." Cribbage or the circuit, he adds, "It's not about the money, it's not about the competition, it's about having fun with the people we meet."

One more thing—Midnight Elvis isn't a moniker Norm randomly thought up one day. Perhaps the most amazing thing about him is that he's totally blind, but you'd never know from seeing him perform. After thanking Norm for speaking with me, he cleared his throat, dropped an octave, and responded, "Thank you—thankyouverymuch!" He knew I was waiting for it. CW



TOC Invitation Criteria

Can't wait for your TOC invitation to show up in the (e)mail? If you have met at least one of the criteria listed below, then you have qualified to play in this invitation-only event and can begin to make your travel arrangements to Reno NV. All criteria apply to the cribbage season ending on July 31, 2011.

If you earn a one-year invitation more than one way (e.g., you are club champion and winner of a sanctioned event), you cannot split them up to provide multiple invitations stretched over consecutive years. After a one-year invitation is used—even if you met multiple one-year criteria—then you have to requalify the next year.

The one-year criteria marked with an asterisk (*) have a three-year option; that is, if you receive an invitation on the basis of an asterisked criterion, you may use it in 2012, 2013, or 2014. Once used, however, the invitation expires, and you must requalify in subsequent years.

Two other requirements must be met in order to play in the TOC: (1) you must be an ACC member, and (2) you must be age 21 by February 10, 2011 (a deferment is available if you are not 21 by this date).
