2010-2011 Season Closes

Roland led the field for six months, occasionally yielding the driver's seat to Life Master (*) Erik Locke (Portland OR), who finished the season in fifth place, or to up-and-comer Life Master (*) Willie Evans (Richland WA), who finished sixth.

My Deal




People sometimes ask why they never see their name in *Cribbage World*. My standard answer is that they didn't pay the \$50 fee!

Of course, I almost never charge a fee to print someone's name in CW. It's simply a matter of performing some cribbage feat worthy of recognition.

In case you need a reminder of the various options open to you, here's a (nearly) complete list of how to see your name in black and white:

- **Join the ACC.** Every month the names of new members appear in a state-by-state listing.
- Write a story about your Grass Roots club. Something memorable, unique, or strange happen in club last night? Let Grass Roots Corner columnist Dave Gerke know the details right now—before you forget 'em.
- Win a tournament. Better yet, win a major and get your picture on the cover of CW!
- Win an internet tournament. Ditto.
- Get a 29-hand or 28-hand. Big hands are recognized each month in the list of tournament results.
- Have a unique cribbage board that others might enjoy seeing? Contact Jay Fulwider to find out if it's suitable for the Cribbage Board of the Month column.
- Celebrate a milestone birthday. If your age ends in a zero, CW wants to know about your upcoming b-day.
- Run for the BOD. Every odd-num-

- bered year BOD candidates are allotted 200 words to state their campaign platform—accompanied by a gargantuan photo of each candidate.
- Buy an ad. Commercials in keeping with the ACC's goal to promote cribbage are accepted for every issue. Rates are reasonable, and you can print your name in big, bold type.
- Become a judge. It costs a measley three bucks to take the judge's test, but you get a cool certificate—and you learn something about the rules of the game.
- Write a letter to the editor. Got a pet cribbage peeve? Did the CW editor's column really fry your grits? Let him—and the entire ACC membership—know where you stand.
- Hand me my worst loss of the month and your name appears in the box below. Observant readers will notice that there's also room to include the name of the player that I beat by the most points each month.
- Make sure you did something twentyfive years ago. To see your name in the "25 Years Ago" column, either you had continued on page 15

Cribbage World Back Issues

I have just read the latest CW cover to cover. The explanation of abbreviations used in the magazine was great! Several references were made to a previous issue of CW for more info (for example, how MRPs are earned). All the references were to issues published long before I became an ACC member. Are the back issues available on the internet? If so, please direct me to them. If not, is this something that could be done?

CW response: Yes, back issues of *Cribbage World* are available online, but before I get to that, please note that the seasonal dates for the GRNT and GRRT were reversed in last month's issue: the GRNT is held in the spring of each year, and the GRRT in the fall. Here's how to find CW back issues:

- go to cribbage.org
- click on "Cribbage World" in the left column
- for any issue from 2009, 2010, and 2011, click on the appropriate link in the center column
- for any issue from 2008 and previous, click on "Cribbage World Archives" in the right column

Questionable Cribbage Rule

An unusual situation occurred at our Grass Roots club a couple weeks ago. The dealer dealt the cards, and each player placed two cards in the crib. The cards were cut, and the pone placed a card down to begin pegging. When the card was played, two cards that were stuck together separated.

It was then noted that the pone had five cards in his hand. The rule in this situation made the pone's hand dead, but pegging continued with only the dealer scoring points. This rule doesn't seem fair because the dealer made the mistake of dealing too many cards to the pone, and when the pone didn't notice the mistake because two cards were stuck together he was penalized. It would seem that a redeal would be more applicable in this situation.

CW response: Don is referring to rule 4.4d.13 (page 17 in the 2010 rulebook), which states, "The dealer's pegging points count. Any points scored by the pone during the pegging are retracted. The pone's hand is dead. The dealer's hand is counted." While this may seem harsh, the pone shares equal responsibility for counting his/her cards to make sure that there are six—and only six—of 'em. Rule 4.2b reinforces this concept: "The pone has a responsibility to observe the dealing and to call attention to any irregularities."

Cribbage on Rosh Hashanah

I have been an ACC member since 1988 and a cribbage player since 1942. I was planning on attending Grand National until I realized that the second day of Rosh Hashanah falls on the first day of Grand National. I would not expect the ACC to schedule a tournament on Good Friday or similar Christian holiday or any other major religious observance day. mento CA), sleeping in his own bed only twice during the month. Starting with Susanville CA on July 1 and ending with Sunnyside WA on July 31, he played ten tournaments, making the cut in six of ten mains and in two of four consolations. He earned MRPs at eight events (missing out entirely only in Vacaville CA on July 23 and Sonoma CA on July 24). He won three main tourneys, took second in a consolation, and had two semifinal and one quarterfinal finishes. He earned qualifying MRPs in five of his six main qualifications, including high qualifier in Topaz and second high qualifier in Reno.

Region All Star team! In addition, of the 3,564 current ACC members who have earned MRPs, Duane's one-month total of 829 would rank #1,074 lifetime!

Duane's cards were running so hot in July that he racked up the most MRPs that he—or anyone—has ever earned in one month, and he even won a sixty-player poker tourney. In a sense, Duane controlled his own destiny, as three times he went head-to-head with Roland in the playoffs, and Duane prevailed all three times, which had significant bearing on the final standings.

DUANE TOLL'S VERY BUSY JULY

During July alone Duane earned 829 MRPs, overtook Roland by 229 MRPs, earned his third consecutive and seventh national championship (previous championships were in 1987, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2009, and 2010), and set a new MRP record of 2,771!

To put Duane's 829 MRPs in July into perspective, consider this. During the 2010–2011 season, 1,557 ACC members earned MRPs. Duane's July total alone was higher than 1,519 of them; put another way, his 829 MRPs during July would rank #38 in the nation last season, and it would earn him a spot on the Central

scheduling should observe the scheduling of events and take these things in proper perspective.

High Qualifier = Winner of Tourney?

Reading the tournament results in Cribbage World each month, I had noticed that being high qualifier didn't have significant value in regards to winning the tourney. I went through back copies of CW to record final position versus being high qualifier. I looked at the most recent 468 main tournaments and 442 consolations and came up with these results. In the main, the high qualifier won the tournament 12% of the time, came in second or third 24% of the time, and finished fifth or worse in 64% of tournaments. Consolation matches were similar, with 13% winning, second or third 31% of the time, and fifth or worse 56% of the time. Perhaps the slightly higher returns for consolations might be the result of having to play fewer matches, giving more power to seed position, or because there is less pressure to win when the only people in the room are a few players and the tournament director.

In some circles, a skunk is considered a double win, and if money is riding on the outcome of the game it is usually doubled. In the ACC, of course, a win is worth two points, while a skunk is worth three points. If any reader knows why 31 and 61 were chosen as the number of holes to be skunked or double skunked by, please let CW know.



There are three things you should know about hobos:

- They can sing and dance very well, and many are natural storytellers.
- Hoboism is increasingly recognized as an important part of 19th- and early 20th-century nation-building. This self-proclaimed migratory workforce helped build the roads and railways that form the intricate web and infrastructure of the United States' transportation routes.
- When work was scarce, they often relied on craftwork to support themselves from

town to town. Some carved cribbage boards.

For a few days in August, the small town of Britt IA is host to the National

Hobo Convention. I spent a few days there this year and learned quite a bit about this often maligned and misunderstood group of people.

The etymology of *hobo* is attributed to a few different sources; some early 'bos carried hoes, and the words *hoe boy* may have been shortened to *hobo*. Others attribute it to early foremen calling "Ho, boy!" when in need of an extra hand on the farm or railroad, hailing nomadic passersby.

Whichever the case, I met some of the most well-known hobos of the twentieth century, those who could still speak about

life after the Depression on the "high iron" of the Burlington Northern railroads and other diesel and steam-driven engines.

At the National Hobo Museum on Britt's Main Avenue, I met Linda Hughes, curator and preserver of hobo memorabilia. I learned about Irving "Fishbones" Stevens and saw a hobo-style cribbage board he made years ago. The metal board is driven through with five bronze pins, while a small screw hides four copper pegs. Fishbones was known to make many wooden boards, but this is the only metal one anyone knows about.

I also met Frog, former King of the Hobos (1997), who described Fishbones as a "genteel and kind-hearted wanderer." Frog plays

the game as well, and learned it from a hobo named **Pinky** in the late '50s, after Frog ran away from the comfortable New England life he knew. He spoke of hobo and cribbage codes of honor. Of the muggins rule, he laughed, saying he liked to cheat . . . *legally*: "Only after the opponent has counted his points!" CW

Tom Mintner died suddenly on July 25 at age 70. A member of the ACC and Milwaukee Club 6 for over twenty years, he was a Master with four main wins (two at the Milwaukee Challenge) and one consolation. He also earned his Bronze Award in Grass Roots play. A great opponent, he will be missed.

Dave Stratford

Dave Stratford (Napa CA) passed away August 13 after a yearlong battle with cancer. He loved both cribbage and poker. In both he was a formidable competitor. But win or lose, he was always a good sport. He was also a great help to new players, both welcoming them and helping them. Dave was a charter member of the Napa CA Century Peggers. While playing in Club 100 he earned his Silver Award. He also won a couple of weekend tourneys and was nearing the Master level. Sadly cancer cut his life short just eleven days shy of his 55th birthday. He will be greatly missed by his fellow players.

Cribbage Quiz Answer

A 0-to-15 improvement by the cut card can happen *only* in the crib. The crib must contain 4-6-J plus either a 9, 10, Q, or K; all four cards must be in the same suit; and the cut card must be a 5 of the same suit. This yields three 15-2s, a run of three (4-5-6), nobs, and a five-card flush—for a total of 15 points.

Youth Teaching Tip

Many youngsters learning the game of cribbage are already card players. They may know games such as poker, blackjack, and other games where the Ace can be used as either a high or low card. Since some of your students may be used to this concept, it is important in the early stages of teaching cribbage to continually remind them that the Ace can be only a low card in cribbage. In my teaching experience, I have had to correct several new players who tried to claim a run with Q-K-A, even after stressing that an Ace is low. Be on the lookout for this closely as you work with your students.
