

My Deal by David Aiken



Just in case you've not noticed, I like playing cribbage. But like anything in life, too much of the same old thing in the same old way can get boring. So I like to mix things up a bit.

For example, after playing, say, ten tournaments in a row—all two-day affairs, with twenty-two games in the main and nine in the consolation, with the prerequisite Friday and Saturday night satellites—it's sometimes enjoyable to attend a one-day tourney, or a midweek tourney, or a match-play tourney, or a tourney in another region.

The lure of the unusual has driven me to create and direct some specialty tournaments, the GRTOC, regional batting average contests, and the ACC Challenge.

And the lure of the unusual is why I'm enthusiastic about the national PPM contest directed by **Rick Shea** (Eureka CA). The idea behind this contest is very simple: who averages the most MRPs at main tourneys throughout the season?

The PPM ("points per main") contest was created to Rick, in his words, "to give people a chance to compare themselves to players across the country on a more or less even playing field." You may not

be able to make All American by playing in fifty tournaments a year, but average MRPs earned per main provides a good comparison of skill.

Who should enter this contest? For starters, anyone who has ever made the All American team. And anyone in the top fifty in their region. And anyone who plays twenty tournaments a year. If you play this many tourneys, there's no reason why you shouldn't enter the PPM contest.

So, do yourself a favor and enter this contest. This will give you the chance to prove that *you* can earn MRPs at a higher average than **Tom Cookman** and also show your support for one of the ACC's bright, creative TDs.

The contest rules are given on page 10 and also posted on the ACC website; log on to cribbage.org and click on the "1st Annual North American Average Points Per Main Challenge" link in the right column. Or you may contact Rick via email at Iv2dve4ab@hotmail.com.

Note: while the official start of the contest is August 1, Rick will allow late entries up through August 23, provided that you report all tourneys played before that date along with their results.

Vote for Candidates from Your Region

In regard to the disappointing voter turnout, another factor may be that we're trying to decide who to vote for when we have never met some of the candidates. Other than the bios provided in CW, there isn't much to go on. What if the percentage of members voting in each region dictated the number of directors who were elected? What if the members voted for directors from only their region? Say there were 1,000 members in the Eastern Region and 150 voted; 3,000 members in the Western Region and 450 voted; and 2,000 members in the Central Region with 300 voting. Each region would have 15% of its members deciding who was going to run the ACC. The result would be the same percentage of directors being elected from each region (eight). We could then use the highest voting percentages to determine any remaining position(s). By limiting it to the candidates in your region, members may know them and be



River City Open Grand Master Julie Felkins (Woodland CA) apparently doesn't need first deal to win her playoff matches. Her opponents dealt first in every playoff match, but Julie overcame this (supposed) disadvantage and prevailed in every match—including one game in which she pegged 7 holes against an opponent who was in hole 120 with first count! And what does it mean that Julie trailed two games to none before coming back in both playoff matches against women, but beat her male opponents three games to zip in rounds one, four, and five?!

Potawatomi Peggers Powwow Master Bart Jaeger (Omaha NE) barely squeaked into the main tourney playoffs as the low qualifier after posting a 26/13. And once there he was one and done, but in that short span of time, he managed to score a 29-hand in his match against Life Master (2*) Doug Page (Oostburg WI)!





Cribbage Board of the Month

BY JAY FULWIDER

The cribbage board for this month is made of Bakelite on a wood base. Considered the world's first synthetic plastic, Bakelite was developed in 1907 by chemist Leo Baekland of New York.

This particular board was made under a United States Design Patent #127,917, issued June 24, 1941, to Calvin D. Williams of (Cloquet MN)



and Abner H. Nerhaugen of (Duluth MN). The board is called "The Arrow Cribbage Board" and made by the Arrow Cribbage Board Co. of Duluth MN. The arrow

design was to help players stay on the right track and was the reason for the patent.

This Bakelite board was produced using a mold (see close-up photo) and fits over a wood base that allows room for card and peg storage. At first, I thought this board might be a prototype and never put into production. I was guess-



ing that the timing of WWII might have impacted its going to production. However, my friend and fellow board collector, **Peter Leach** (St. Paul MN), has this board with the box and instructions, which means that the board was commercially produced. The questions now are how long did the company make boards and how many.

In the past, I have asked ACC members to let me know if they can provide any additional information on boards in my articles. Thanks to all of you who have responded. Now I hope I can get lucky with this board and that someone will be able to add to its history.
