A SEASON OF RECORDS

The 2013–14 tournament season drew to a close on July 31, with 2,492 combined entrants competing in 41 sanctioned mains and consolations during the last month of the season. More than half of these entrants (1,256) duked it out in five coast-to-coast locations in the final week of play—559 in Raleigh NC, 238 in Chaska MN, 220 in Vacaville CA, 144 in Sunnyside WA, and 95 Pahrump NV—with the top players jockeying for positions on the All American team or the regional All Star teams. When the final peg was put in hole 121, the curtain came down on another fantastic year of cribbage.

Here are the highlights of the 2013–14 season:

- Life Master (2★) **Erik Locke** (Wood Village OR) was national champion, for the second time, by a slim 27 MRPs—the closest margin of victory since the 1998–99 season, when Life Master (3★) **Bob Julian** (deceased) beat **William Summers II** (Seaside CA) by 9 points. See page 13 for the story of why Life Master (7★) **Duane Toll** (Sutherlin OR) is *not* the national champion.
- Life Master (★) **Jeff Shimp** (Grand Haven MI) *tied* the record of Life Master (3★) **James Langley** (Red Bluff CA) of seven sanctioned-tourney wins in a single season.
- Erik Locke *beat* James Langley's record of seven sanctioned-tourney wins in a season, with eight six sanc-

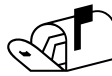

My Deal

GOYA is great. Eating right is helpful. One final piece of the puzzle will help you play smart cribbage. (Apart, of course, from actually learning to play smart cribbage.)

And that is proper sleep. If you show up at a tournament on Saturday morning bleary-eyed and half asleep, there's a real good chance you won't be playing your best during the first few games.

An article on npr.org highlights the connection between stress and sleep (search for "Skimming on Sleep"). When life throws you a curveball and stress is unavoidable, keep these points in mind:

- Daytime stress follows you into the night. Relieving this stress, or at least putting it out of mind, will help you sleep more soundly. Slow down and unwind before bedtime.
- Most adults need between seven and eight hours of sleep every night. If you don't get enough sleep, this sleep defi-

ciency will follow you into the next day and cut into your proficiency and make you exhausted, moody, and forgetful (a particularly unhelpful trait for cribbage players).

- Go to bed and get up at the same time, even on weekends, in order to train your brain's biological clock to release the sleep hormone melatonin.
- Get all the gadgets—cellphone, computer, TV—out of the bedroom because the short-wave light that these screens emit suppresses melatonin. Cool, dark, and quiet should describe your bedroom.
- Daily exercise will also help you sleep better.

As with my columns on exercise and diet, not all of these tips will work for everyone, but hopefully you can find some takeaway lessons in each of them.

Now that we're well rested, getting plenty of exercise, and eating right, let's get out there and play smart cribbage! **CW**

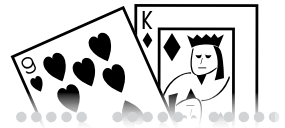

tioned wins this season—plus the prestigious Tournament of Champions in February.

- Life Master **Beth Widener** (Green Bay WI) earned 613 MRPs during nine days in Oregon. By earning 2,126 MRPs this season, Beth set the record for most MRPs scored by a Central Region player—previously 2,003 MRPs, set by Life Master (3★) **Wayne Steinmetz** (Hartland WI) in 2010. Beth also set the record for most MRPs scored by a female in a season—previously 1,818 MRPs, set by Life Master (★) **Sharlene Medeiros** (deceased) in 2005.
- Life Master (★) **Roger Wilson** (Westminster CO) had the highest scorecard of the season: 45/19 +441 at the Cowboy Country Open on August 3.
- Life Master (3★) **James Langley** (Red Bluff CA) was elected to the Hall of Fame.
- Life Master (★) **Les Sumner** (Sparks NV) scored both a 29-hand and a 28-hand at

the Oregon Championship on April 19.

- **Duane Toll** earned the first Life Master (7★) Award in ACC history and passed the lifetime MRP total of Life Master (6★) **DeLynn Colvert** (Missoula MT). Just days later, DeLynn became the ACC's second Life Master (7★).
- Two players—**Erik Locke** and Life Master **Beth Widener**—took second place six times throughout the season, proving that they are vulnerable. In addition, five players took second place five times: Life Master (3★) **Roland Hall** (Napa CA), **John Hazlett** (Grand Rapids MI), Life Master (★) **Michael Rowe** (Auburn WA), Grand Master **Peggy Shea** (Eureka CA), and **Duane Toll**. With this much excitement in a single season, it's hard to believe that 2014–15 could possibly be better, but you better stick around, because you never know what's gonna happen with this crazy game we play! **CW**

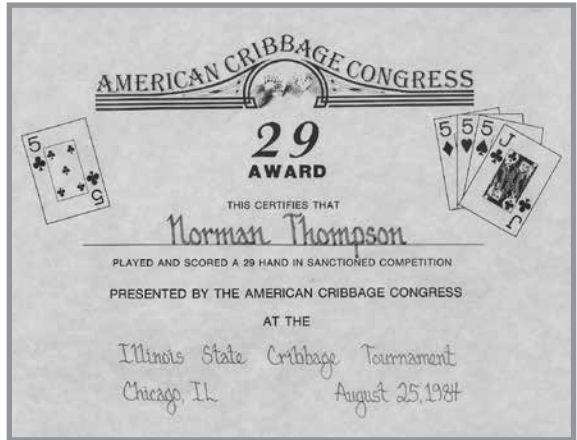
Tourney Tidbits

But for the fourth time since 2008, Dan has turned in a qualifying score in the consolation that was higher than what he had in the main—and then made it to the finals of each consolation, taking second three times (Wisconsin Rapids Open in October 2009, Susanville Summer Classic in July 2012, and Topaz Summer Classic in July 2014) and winning the Lake Superior Challenge consolation in June 2014.

Chaska Tourney Cluster Life Master **Robert Chase** (Minneapolis MN) and Life Master (★) **Cy Madrone** (Santa Barbara CA) qualified in the same three events, and each time Cy was chased from the playoffs by Robert! Chase went on to finish second in two mains and first in a consolation.

National Open **Mary Ann and Doug Kelliher** (The Villages FL) got knocked out of the main tourney in Raleigh, so they played the Saturday night special. Perhaps “dominated” is a better verb to use, as Mary Ann won the tourney, and Doug had not one but two 28-hands! In addition, Mary Ann also had a 28-hand in the Open Opener, the midweek tourney preceding the National Open.

Summer's End Remember the old canard that starting a tournament with a skunk is a curse? Well, **Richard Hinrichs** (Redding CA) proved that getting skunked in the first game is a blessing! After a 46-point beat-down in his first game, Richard won the next thirteen games and was high qualifier with 29/13 +212. He went on to win the one-day tournament and in the finals beat Life Master (7★) **Duane Toll** (Sutherlin OR). This tourney was the last one of the season for Duane, and with the 70 MRPs he earned for second place, Duane ended the season at 2,752—a mere 27 points behind national champion Life Master (2★) **Erik Locke** (Wood Village OR). If Duane had beaten Richard in the finals, he would have earned 35 more MRPs and been the national champion for the bazillionth time. It just goes to show the impact that a 1869/2000ths Master can have on the national race. It looks like Erik owes Richard a drink!

I have a "concrete" example to illustrate her point. In September 2010, I drove home from the Grand National in Virginia Beach. Because there are virtually no tournament players where I live, I

almost always travel solo, and this was no exception. I left the hotel on my nine-hour journey back to Akron OH, taking numerous breaks along the way. As I crossed the border into Ohio, I was starting to get tired and considered spending the night at a hotel. However, I didn't want to spend the money and decided to continue driving. About twenty miles from home, I was suddenly awakened when my car drifted into the concrete divider on the interstate. I didn't receive a scratch, but my car had \$6,000 of damage. Instead of spending \$60 or \$70 on a hotel, that decision cost me more than \$1,000 in repairs and rental car costs. I'm very fortunate it didn't cost me my life.

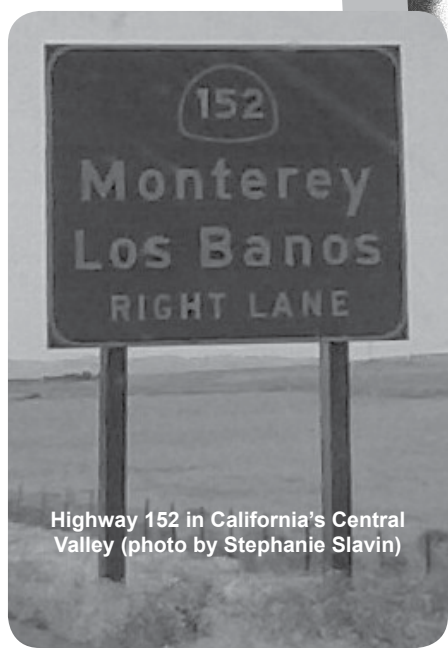

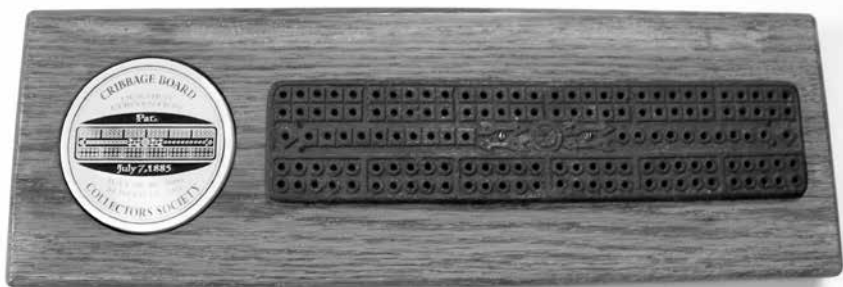
Cribbage Board of the Month

This month features a one-of-a-kind cribbage board that I designed in 2002.

My father-in-law, **Herb Zwemke** (Lewistown MT), made the board. The ceramic disc is from the first Cribbage Board Collectors Society (CBCS) convention held on July 28–30, 2000, in Roseville MN. Even though I was a cribbage board collector, I was not aware of CBCS at the time and did not attend the convention. When I joined the ACC in 2001, I discovered CBCS on the ACC website and signed up.

I attended my first CBCS convention in 2002 at Riverside CA. The ceramic disc was left over from the first convention, and I was lucky enough to buy it at auction. The board pictured on the disc is a C. W. LeCount, Model #2 or #3. It was made



in the late 1800s and sold through Sears and Wards catalogs. The metal board mounted next to the disc is almost identical: a LeCount board made during a later period when James L. Hoyt worked with LeCount. During the Hoyt period, the quality of the boards dropped off (likely to save on costs).

There have been fourteen CBCS conventions, and each year about twenty commemorative boards are made. I have ten of the boards and have featured a few of them in past articles.

This year's convention is September 26–28 in Portland OR. Maybe that commemorative board will appear in a future article.

The President's Column

These kids were treated very respectfully by what is, of course, mostly an older crowd. Mel said that he saw players making great efforts to see that the kids were treated well. And he said that he had good feedback from the players about his grandchildren. That evening when they got home, they had a family meeting where they talked about their experiences for almost two hours. Mel said that it was a great “memory event” for them. story, and it is legal in Oregon for minors to play in cribbage tournaments.)

The second story involves a lady who plays in an Oregon club and has improved her play tremendously over the past year (she told me this story in confidence, so I will not mention her name). She recently traveled with her husband to play in a cluster of tournaments. During the qualifying round in one of them, she was made to feel quite uncomfortable when some of her opponent’s friends stood behind her. She felt they were influencing the play somehow, and they made some very rude comments, which she readily heard, about how she was “in over her head” and “why was she playing in a tournament”? She is thinking of not playing in tournaments anymore. When she told me this, I got upset. How *dare* they make such comments? Are they so egotistical, judgmental, and conceited that they think only players of a certain level should be allowed to play? I told her that it was only their *opinion*, and that opinions are often not based on facts, especially when they are expressed by rude, insensitive people.

This organization exists for teaching, promoting, and playing cribbage in a fair, fun, and regulated environment. Each one of us has the power to help the ACC continue successfully simply by being courteous and respectful.

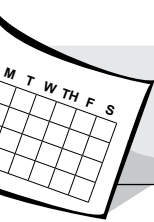
