Has the Rules Committee considered having the high qualifier of the pair become dealer in that first game? If so, what was the reason for continuing the practice of cutting for deal?

Editor's response: the BOD has allowed the practice of top seed dealing first in a playoff match on a trial basis, but it is not common. Here's an anecdote from the 2012 Reindeer Games held in Grand Rapids MI, which used the top-seed-dealing-first concept. The winners had vastly different opinions of this idea. David Aiken (Ada MI) qualified low in the main and so never had first deal in any match, yet won the tournament and loved the concept. On the other hand, Doug Page (Oostburg WI) qualified high in the consy and had first deal in all but his final match; he also won the tourney, but disliked the concept. Moral of the story (using

Play **smart**, play **fair**, play **fast**—but mostly play **nice**

With the 2019 BOD election behind us, it is time for my biannual look at voting trends.

There are two main takeaways from this year's election: #1—only twenty-six candidates ran for twenty-five positions, and #2—only 566 ACC members voted. To put it bluntly: both numbers are pathetically low.

The most significant number is the precipitous drop in voting members. This year less than one in ten (9.3%) eligible ACC members voted in the BOD election. This represents the lowest percentage of voting participation in the last three decades (see table below).

Even the percentage of online voters took a nosedive this year, dropping from

54% to 41.3%:

As noted elsewhere in this issue, the Western Region again filled ten slots on the BOD (the most allowed to any one region according to the ACC policy).

Finally, with twenty men and only five women, this election is a retrograde step in the male-female imbalance that pervades the ACC.

On Saturday night at the North Conway NH tripleheader, I was practicing discards with my partner for the upcoming Canadian Doubles event. We dealt ten cards to each player and then made up two hands and a crib (which alternated between players; we cut for the starter card and then counted the hands. David Statz walked by and asked why we didn't include pegging as well, so we started a game that added this feature.

The pone would pick a hand to peg with first, and the dealer would pick his/her first hand as well. The pegging points would be scored, and then the pone recorded the score of the first hand, followed by the dealer's points. After that, the second hand would be played the same way. Finally, the dealer score his/her crib.

We dubbed this form of the game "Canadian Singles." As with Canadian Doubles, most games ended on four deals or with the first count of the fifth hand. This created some interesting strategy on Fourth Street.

If you are a Canadian Doubles fan I highly recommend you try this version. Feel free to email me with any tweaks you think might improve the game.

Niagara Tales ◆Master Paul Eichler (Medina NY) scored a perfect 14/7 +67 in the seven-game Early Bird at the Western New York Open in Hamburg NY on April 26. Is this a "grand slam" or perhaps a "baby slam"—or just an awesome card?!

- ◆In answer to the question *Can Canadians can play Canadian Doubles?* the answer is yes! At the WNYO, four Ontarians captured the top two spots: **Laurie Ryan** (Ottawa) and **Ron Drake** (Kitchener) took first, with **Gail Bourhill** (Kitchener) and **Dan Shirk** (Kitchener) finishing second in the ten-team event.
- ◆In the playoffs of the WNYO main, George Lozy (Rochester NY) beat his first opponent 3–1, losing a single game by two points. George immediately took a 2–0 lead over his opponent in the semifinals, Russell Bentley (Lyndon-ville NY). In game three, George was counting first from five holes out and had only three points. In the fourth game George managed to reach hole 120 and had first count, but Russell was at hole 119 and paired George's lead card. In the fifth game George again had first count from hole 119, with Russell at hole 118. Russell paired George's fourth card and won the game. In all, George lost four games by a total of seven points. Russell went on to win the tournament, George went home to lick his wounds.

Quads In their semifinal match in the Michigan Cribbage Cup main, Life Master (3*) Doug Page (Oostburg WI) and Rod Hovey (Kalamazoo MI) were tied at two games each. Doug had first count from eight holes away, while Rod was dealing from sixteen holes out. Here's how the pegging went:

Needing 23 points with first count, Dale passed Frosty 6-6-7-7 and kept pegging cards for himself, tossing Q-K in the crib. The cut card was a 4, leaving Frosty with four

points, giving Dale a pair for two points, and a dead crib for six total points. In the next game, they move out 58 points on their deal.—submitted by Dale Magedanz, CW's Milwaukee correspondent



Cribbage Board of the Month

his leather, "vest pocket" cribbage board is similar to one that I featured in the April 2018 Cribbage World. The main difference is that the leather peg holder folds out in one piece instead of two. Also, I am able to see the leather "Trade Mark" stamp and verify some earlier research by fellow collector Terry Coons.

Almost all leather products have a maker's stamp. On this board the



stamp is a "Keystone" with an "R" in the middle. That is the stamp for C. F. Rumpp & Sons, Fine Leather, Philadelphia PA. The company was established in 1850. Their original building is on the list of historical buildings

and still stands at the corner of North Fifth Street

and Cherry Street.

This board dates to around the mid to late 1800s. Because of the silver witch on the board, I am guessing it was made as a souvenir board to be sold in Salem MA. The Sa-

lem Witch Trials occurred in 1692-93. They are a historic part of old Salem and still at-

tract visitors to this day. CW

Don't Forget to Flush!

Cribbage—like many card games—has some anomalies that don't seem to make sense. For example, why does the dealer get two points for a cut Jack when it is the pone who went to all the effort to find this card? And why does it take five cards to form a flush in the crib, but only four cards for a flush in the hand? These features may well have had some rational basis at one time, but this reason has been lost to history with the passage of time.

Here's a cribbage variant that expands the flush concept to pegging. When three or more cards of the same suit are played consecutively during the pegging phase of the game, one point is awarded for each card.





For example, if the following cards were played from the Diamond suit, the pegging would go like this:

pone	6d		3d (for 3)		5d (for 7)
dealer		Qd		7d (for 4)	

The third consecutive Diamond card played receives three points for the flush, the fourth Diamond receives four points, and the fifth Diamond receives five points plus two points for 31-2.

Playing this cribbage variation forces you to pay more attention to which card suits you hold—and play!

The results of the 2019 election for the ACC's Board of Directors were announced on June 18 by ACC President **David Campbell**, after having been certified by **Megan Player** (Election Supervisor) and **Keith Widener** (Vice President of Policy and Ethics).

This year only 566 valid ballots were returned, representing 9.3% of the eligible voting member-

ship (6,085). This percentage represents a sharp downturn in voter participation from previous years. (See page 6 for more voting trends.)

Sixteen paper ballots were invalidated due to no/incorrect code; this represents the lowest number of paper ballots that have been tossed in any election cycle.

Continuing a pattern that has held since 1997, the Western Region captured ten of the twenty-five available slots on the BOD. The Central Region seated nine candidates, with the Eastern Region filling out the remaining six seats (these numbers represent the same regional BOD makeup as the 2017 election).

Four directors are new to the BOD: **Dan Selke** (who as a first-time candidate finished a

Connecticut's Hartford Metro Club 26, with a thirty-year tradition of competitive cribbage throughout New England and around the country, recently lost a longtime member, Life Master/Silver Bill Richmond (Stafford Springs CT). The club collected a donation in Bill's honor and sent \$525 to the ACC's Youth Program. This endeavor of the ACC was near and dear to Bill, who understood how important and necessary it is to develop generational interest in the game he so loved and mastered. Bill's presence, competitive play, and compassion will be missed by his fellow club members and the wider cribbage community.

Years Ago in the ACC

The cover of the July 1994 *Cribbage World* reported that **Al Grantz** (Kelso WA) won his second event—the 103-player Cascade Classic in Redmond OR—in a period of eight days.

Elsewhere we read that **Wayne Steinmetz** (then of Milwaukee WI, now of Hartland WI) defeated **Marlene Lazachek** (Franklin WI) in the finals of the 78-player Potawatomi Peggers main in St. Joseph MI. This win—along with qualifying #2—allowed Wayne to earn the ACC's 188th Master award. Wayne is now the ACC's #6 all-time points leader, with 27,303 MRPs. And on

page 9 we find a mention of the start of the ACC's Youth Program—now a vital part of ACC cribbage on the West Coast.



Mary Alice Russell inherited her love of cribbage from her father. He taught her at

their kitchen table when she was twelve years old. In addition to his pegging proficiency, Mary Alice's father was an avid collector of pennies until his death in 2002.

Flash forward to January 2019. Mary Alice was attending the Medeiros Memorial cribbage tournament in Wolfeboro NH. She had not done well in the main on Saturday, and woke up the next morning wanting to skip the consy and instead make an early start back to her home on Martha's Vineyard.

But then the shower of pennies from heaven began. Mary Alice found three different pennies within a short period of time and realized that she was meant to play the consolation. The tournament itself was surreal as she felt her father's presence as he and his three cribbage buddies cheered her on all the way to the finals, where she placed second.

And it was then that Mary Alice realized: "I can do it now! I have time. The girls are starting their senior year of college—

no more excuses!" She decided to bring tournament cribbage to Martha's Vineyard by

establishing a Grass Roots club.

Mary Alice had joined the ACC in January 2006 at the instigation of her then-boyfriend/later-husband **Bill Russell**. She was living in Dennis MA at the time and became a proud member of Cape Cod Club 308. Little did she realize how fortuitous this connection with the club's director, **Jack Puleo**, would become in the future.

It was goodbye to Grass Roots play when Mary Alice and her twin daughters moved to Martha's Vineyard to join Bill in the summer of 2006. The Russell Family Cribbage Smackdown was created to fill this cribbage void, and the couple has played a nine-game tournament once or twice a week for over fourteen years. Rumor has it that Bill is in the lead but only by a "very small" margin.

The two have also played at numerous landmarks around the world, including the Eiffel Tower, Times Square, the Pantheon, Notre Dame, and Bobby Flay's



restaurant GATO, the latter generating the greatest spectator reaction. But none of these world travels compensated for the lack of competitive cribbage at home on the Vineyard. Cue the rain of pennies from heaven and Mary Alice's consequent epiphany to start a Grass Roots club.

Mary Alice began her quest at the font of all things cribbage, aka the ACC website, and quickly discovered the site's helpful section "Starting a Grass Roots Club." Following its recommendations, she first sought a suitable place to play.

Her coworker at Martha's Vineyard Hospital and fellow cribbage enthusiast, Tricia Bergeron, served on the board of the local Portuguese-American Club. The P.A. Club provided a welcoming venue for the new venture on Wednesday nights. Coincidentally, Tricia and her husband, Roy Scheffer, played doubles with a small group at that same locale on Friday nights. The members of this doubles group provided a core starter base for Mary Alice's endeavors. Mary Alice credits Tricia, as well as her own husband Bill, as the two pillars of support without which she could not have undertaken, much less succeeded, in her Grass Roots efforts.

The second step in "Starting a Grass Roots Club" is marketing. Besides utilizing word of mouth from her core group, Mary Alice also prepared flyers and posted them at various coffeehouses and local businesses on the Island. A club logo was designed to be used extensively on t-shirts, mugs, and pins for ongoing marketing efforts. Mary Alice's most successful marketing tool was the closed Facebook group "Islanders Talk," which serves the approximate 18,000 people who live on Martha's Vineyard year-round. Her first



post of the proposed Grass Roots club generated over one hundred comments in only two days.

The third recommended step is to determine the new club's playing schedule. The initial decision was to meet the last Wednesday of every month until September, when the club would officially begin. This schedule would allow sufficient time for members to learn and become comfortable with ACC tournament play and regulations.

Mary Alice also assembled various logistical needs such as cribbage boards, pegs, and playing cards, and completed the pertinent paperwork. Her earlier connection to Jack Puleo now came into prominence as he and his ACC knowledge were indispensable to a successful club launch.

Opening night arrived on March 27, 2019, and so did twenty-four people. This first gathering was so successful that the attendees immediately decided to meet evcontinued on page 20

ery week and not just once a month. When asked what surprised her most from this adventure as a whole. Mary Alice identified the enthusiastic reception and immediate embracement of a Grass Roots club that arose from this first meeting. The answer is somewhat ironic given that Mary Alice's biggest fear had been exposing herself to judgment and criticism if people were unhappy with her efforts. As Tricia had advised her, the key

to success lay in Mary Alice sharing her love of the game. And it worked.

The second week brought twenty-six people, with twenty-nine appearing for the third week. An article in the *Vineyard Gazette*, the Island's local paper, stimulated more interest. As of the beginning of June 2019, thirty-eight people have visited the club, with ages ranging from the mid-twenties to upper eighties.

Mary Alice completed the final step of the ACC's "Starting a Grass Roots Club" when she applied for and received an official ACC Grass Roots charter on April 19, establishing Vineyard Cribbage Club 439. Twenty-one people have become ACC members, and the number is expected to grow.

Club 439 will begin season play in September as a Division 4 Lite Club with a



six-game configuration. The Lite option allows "kitchen-table" cribbage players to ease into the more ACC structured format. Players will have time to become accustomed to the rules and appreciate the benefits of such features as a skunk can. After a full year of Lite, the club will revisit the question in September 2020 and decide whether to continue as a Lite club or convert to the standard nine-game format.

When asked what advice she would give to someone thinking about starting a club, Mary Alice answered, "Just do it!" Given how successfully her dream has become reality, there are quite a few cribbage lovers on Martha's Vineyard who are glad she "just did." CW



ACC Cribbage Code of Congeniality

During a new player's trial period (four weeks or until they earn points—whichever is longer) . . .

- We pledge to welcome new players warmly and make them feel wanted.
- We pledge to not penalize new players for violating tournament rules. (We will, instead, gently tell them what the rule is and what the penalty would be.)
- We pledge to not let new players underpeg points or undercount hands. (We will, instead, explain errors and then allow new players to take all points they are entitled to.)
- We pledge to not make new players feel inferior if/when they miss points or make a bad play. (We will, instead, let them know that all cribbage players do this and that it is part of the learning process.)
- We pledge to not force new players to play a game in fifteen minutes. (We will, instead, be tolerant and not complain, remembering that we, too, started slow.)
- We pledge to allow new players to play for free or at the minimum cost of club and Grass Roots/ACC expenses.

After the trial period is up ...

 We pledge to continue to make all players—new and existing—feel welcome and comfortable at our club.
