ELECTION RESULTS

SMALL TURNOUT DECIDES THE WINNERS

Only 446 ballots were returned to be tallied in this years' election but we do thank all who took the time to express their preferences. Perhaps a return envelope would have been helpful since last years' response was somewhat higher. This secretary is still learning and trying to improve processes and asks your kind indulgence when some of the decisions that are made do not bring about an improvement.

Our thanks to all the candidates who graciously agreed to run for the Board of Directors. They are all well qualified and have shown their interest and willingness to work for the advancement of the Congress and the game of cribbage.

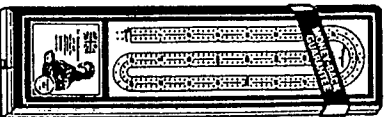

"Fifteen two and two are four."

There are no grammatical errors in these statements. The sentences are correct for you can regard two and two as a single idea and modify the single idea with the singular "is" or you can also regard two and two as separate units and use the plural verb "are." In all other forms of rhetoric, except the use of number operations, the form of the verb must reflect that of the subject it modifies. Which form of the verb do you use in the pegging and count of your cribbage hand? Remember, either, way, you can be correct grammatically if not numerically.
