# My Deal by David Aiken



The American Cribbage Congress has had its share of intelligent, far-sighted, and creative leaders over the past three decades, and many of them have been (or will be) featured in the monthly Hall of Fame sketches. Bob Julian (Franklin WI) has served the ACC for many years as both a BOD member and an executive officer. Lest any of you start to worry, no, this is not a eulogy—Bob is still very much alive and kicking.

Last fall, at the September BOD meeting in Wisconsin Rapids, Bob stepped down as our Vice President of Operations,

and I want to take this occasion to recognize Bob's many contributions that have made our organization bigger and better.

But before I get to that, I offer my apologies to Bill Campbell, the author of last month's Hall of Fame sketch on Nick Pond. Bill's name appeared three times in the May issue, and twice I called him Bob. Not too many cribbage players would be happy with a .333 batting average, and so I fired my proofreader.

Now on to the interview with Bob Julian, conducted via correspondence earlier this year.

#### Where were you born and raised?

Born in Stoughton WI and raised in Janesville WI.

### Where do you live now?

Since 1948 I have lived in Milwaukee and Franklin, a suburb of Milwaukee.

#### What was your career?

I went in the service and to Europe in 1944 with the 42nd Division. I was transferred to the 90th Division in the Battle of the Bulge as a .30 caliber machine gunner. In June 1945 I was transferred to the staff of the official army newspaper *Stars and Stripes* in Paris and later assigned to the production staff of the German edition in Pfungstadt, Germany. I helped to close down editions in Nice-Marseille, London, and Paris and then went back to Germany, where I finished as production manager of the Pfungstadt edition. I returned to the States in 1946 and was discharged in April. I was owner of a printing company

from 1954 to 1961, board chairman and president of Spectracolor Inc. from 1961 through 1985. This company specialized in the manufacture of printing plates for aluminum cans for the beverage industry

and was sole supplier for five Schlitz Brewing Co. can plants, which produced more than fifty billion cans between 1973 and 1985. I liquidated the company in 1985 when I retired.

### When did you join the ACC?

In 1980 and became a life member in 1981. Joe Wergin was Wisconsin life member no. 1, and I was no. 2. About 1985 or 1986 I met Wisconsin Governor Anthony Earl, signed him up as an ACC member, and asked him to play in one of our tournaments. The next year when I got my ACC membership card, I was Wisconsin no. 3!

## What was your first tournament?

Milwaukee in 1980. I qualified and

lost in the first round to Bob Immel of Minnesota.

What was your first tournament win? Milwaukee in 1981.

How much was the prize money? \$178.

# How many tournaments do you play each year?

Since the 1993–94 season I have played in 517 tournaments (an average of 37 per year). I have made 193 flying trips (averaging 14 per year) and have totaled 16,861 MRPs (1,204 per year).

### What is your favorite tournament?

Many. I have played in all 26 Green Bay tournaments, all 34 St. Croix tournaments, and all the Reno tournaments (TOC and the IPW/ACC Open).



- ◆ On the other hand, **Art Burgess** (GA) played cribbage for 45 years before he won a tournament—the Atlanta Classic in April.
- Hal Lamon (WA) had a 28-hand in doubles at the Montana Open in April. This hand is hard enough to find when you are dealt six cards—but try it with only five cards!

# ACC Internet Committee

After being appointed chair of the ACC Rules Committee by the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors, I formed a task group composed of the following persons:

- David Campbell (ME)
- Phyllis Schmidt (MA)
- Wayne Steinmetz (WI)
- Valerie Sumner (NV)

In addition, the following will serve as advisors: Jones Hom (CA) and Roger Lueschow (WA) will interact with me at tournaments about rules problems. Martha Fingleton (WI) and Syl Lulinski (IL), members of the previous rules committee, will provide historical perspective on current rules and previous rules changes. Jeff Shimp (MI) is in charge of the judging program and will look at ideas from the perspective of judges. All of these people are judges or senior judges.

The ACC's official tournament rules (which may be found in the current rule book or online at cribbage.org) were last revised in 2004, and periodically these rules need to be examined and altered, as players and judges discover problems with the way in which rules are interpreted. The rules committee members examine any matter with the rules that they discover or is brought to their attention by the membership. At some point (perhaps in two

years), a set of revisions will be brought to the BOD, and ultimately this will result in a new set of rules for players to follow and judges to enforce.

Sometimes changes are controversial. One such change was the elimination of the "peg out rule." Some players would like to see us return to that earlier rule. Perhaps some of you reading this would like to address this issue, and the rules committee will consider your ideas on this or any other change that you bring to their attention. Not every suggestion will result in a change in the rules, but all will be examined for their merits.

Occasionally the adopted language proves ambiguous and leads to interpretation. For example, rule 8.4a.(1) seems to say that merely "pegging into the game (out) hole" without sufficient points to reach that hole—regardless of whether the peg is released—constitutes false claim of game. But since rule 8.3 notes that "a correction is not permitted after the player's fingers are removed from the peg," the key point seems to be that a player still has the right to make a correction (in this case remove the peg from the game hole) if the peg has not been released. The rules committee will try to clarify issues like this at any time they are needed, even before a rule book revision.

Tony learned to play cribbage as a youngster,



Rule of the Month—Mixing the Crib with Other Cards: If the pone mixes the crib with the pack, the pone is penalized two points and the dealer is permitted to retrieve the crib and peg the value. If there is a disagreement on the cards, summon a judge.

The Grass Roots Corner is always looking for good material for this column. Here are some guidelines to help you decide what to submit. Is the material of interest to the entire ACC? Is the story unique or rare? How recently have we printed an article from your club? Finally, shorter is generally better.

Grass Roots high scorecards—the highest known scorecard for an 18-game GRRT or GRNT was a 37/16 +385 scored in the 2003 GRNT on March 25, 2003, by Willie Evans (WA). The highest scorecard for a 9-game Grass Roots tournament is a 24/9 +303 scored by Stan Hayton (NM) on January 29, 2000.



#### What cribbage tournaments have you directed?

Coordinator of the 1982 Grand National in Milwaukee and co-director of the 1999 Grand National in Las Vegas.

#### Do you play in a Grass Roots club?

Yes, in Milwaukee Club #6. I have played in some 20–25 clubs throughout the U.S., and I think that our club is one of the strongest—and certainly plays the longest: from 8 to 14 players stay and play side games until we are asked to leave at 1:00 or 2:00 a.m.

#### When were you elected to the BOD?

First elected in 1983. I was off the board for four years in the late 1980s and then on the BOD ever since, for a total of twenty years.

# What are your greatest accomplishments as a BOD member?

While I was Director of Publicity and Promotion, the ACC membership increased from about 3,000 to over 5,000. I won the Guy Pence Award twice for bringing in new members. I was in complete charge of the Jeff Monroe case and received \$30,000 restitution for the ACC. I coordinated the selection of Larry Hassett as Membership Secretary and of Bob McCabe as Treasure. I created bonding of ACC members handling large sums of money.

#### What could the ACC do to attract members?

If each ACC member would sign up one new member each year, our membership would double.

# What were your thoughts upon being inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2005?

I thought I was being recognized for many years of serving and promoting the ACC, in spite of the intensity I may display during my play. Yet when the award was presented, I was humbled and speechless.

# The list of your cribbage exploits is long: All American 7 times, National Champion 4 times, 19,635 MRPs lifetime, 23 tournament wins—is there anything you haven't accomplished that you wanted to?

To win the TOC, Grand National, JPW/ACC Open, and finally win a tournament at age 95—maybe 100! Dream on!

## What cribbage exploit are you proudest of?

Winning the ACC's National Championship

and the National Long Match in the same year, 1999, and winning three consecutive tournaments—each in a different region of the country—in June 2002.

If you had a cribbage wish, what would it be? That each player at least once in a lifetime could count a 29-hand in sanctioned play.

#### What tournament win slipped away?

The River City (CA) tournament on March 9, 2003. I had won the tournament the previous year and was playing Richard Wardenburg in the best-of-7 final. I easily won the first three games. Richard took a short break to get spiritual assistance, came back, and won the next three games. The deciding game was close all the way, with Richard winning by one hole—a gracious and happy winner.

# What was the biggest mistake you ever made playing cribbage?

A list of my mistakes would probably take up the rest of this issue of *CW*, but this stands out: letting an opponent peg some 23 points on the last hand of a match, when I needed only 6 points to win.

#### What got you hooked on cribbage?

It was a game that required very little manual dexterity, but a lot of mental exertion. I still have inlaid cribbage boards that I made in 1938.

#### Why did you become a student of the game?

After playing in the ACC for a number of years and many times missing qualifying by only one game, I decided it was about time to figure out why.

#### What fuels your passion for cribbage?

The fact that it keeps me active, traveling all over the U.S.

#### What has cribbage meant in your life?

It has given me an extended family of wonderful, gracious people in all walks of life, who have added immeasurably to my life. May the good Lord bless each and every one of you.

# Where do you predict the ACC will be in twenty years?

Please ask me this question in 2027, at which time I could be the world's oldest living ACC member.
