Virginia Championships

I enjoyed the article about the Michigan All Star Tournament to determine the best club in the state and thought you might be interested in another approach. In 1992 there were three clubs in Virginia: one each in Richmond, northern Virginia, and the Tidewater area. At the behest of Andy Hulcher, we all got together, some sixty strong, and played the first Virginia Championship tournament in Richmond to determine which club was best. While individual players placed or won in the main and consolation tournaments, the players' averages from the main tournament were used to determine the club winner. This beginning morphed into a sanctioned tournament the following year, thus becoming an annual contest that today is the sanctioned Virginia Championships under the able direction of Rick Allen. Even after the sanctioned tournament began, we continued for six years to use averages and present an award to the winning club. I suspect this may have been the first state championship for Grass Roots players, and perhaps this will give other clubs the impetus to set up something similar for their own state.

- Consolation conqueror! Master **Robert Moore** (Virginia Beach VA) has won the last four consolation events he has played in:

 - August 19: Garden State Open (Piscataway NJ)
 - August 25: Richmond Classic (Warfield VA)
- Happy Birthday! Dennis Murphy (Livermore CA) took second place at the Shut Up and Deal tournament in Castro CA on his birthday. And Life Master Herschel Mack (McKinleyville CA) won the consolation tournament for the second year in a row.
- The championship trophies at the Silver City Open in Taunton MA were donated by Cindy Veradt (Taunton MA) in memory of Life Master Zeke Veradt, who passed away in March.

Cribbage players in Grass Roots clubs earn awards for a variety of achievements: 29hands, 28-hands, and grand slams.

All Grass Roots awards earned are submitted to the Grass Roots awards chairman (me) so that the appropriate award may be prepared and mailed to the players. After I receive the award data, I type it into a database: name, date, type of award, ACC number, city, state, and club number. Spelling is verified from the Grass Roots database so that we make sure that names on the award certificates are spelled correctly! Approximately seven hundred awards are mailed out each year, including one hundred or so Bronze, Silver, and Gold awards.

I enter the award data as I receive it. and then about once a month I print the awards. The printed certificates are mailed to the contact person for each club so that the award may be presented to the award winner at their club. In order to do that, I have to match the name of the award winner with the name of his or her club contact, then print a label, put it on the envelope, insert the correct certificate (and pin, where appropriate), tape the envelope shut, weigh it, apply the correct postage, and take it to the post office. Unfortunately, all of this takes longer when incomplete data is submitted. And, of course, I have to purchase postage, envelopes, printer cartridges, labels, and other supplies.

I go through this same process for Bronze and Silver award winners at the end of the Grass Roots season, but the plaques and other prizes associated with Bronze and Silver awards are then ordered by Jeanne Wauters and Joan Rein.

Between serving as Grass Roots awards chairman and a club director, I devote about twenty hours to cribbage work every month. I wish I could do more, but I can't retire yet and work gets in the way too much. I do enjoy it most of the time—especially knowing that my work helps others receive the same enjoyment as I do when playing the greatest two-person card game ever invented.



Everything You've Always Wanted to Know about Cribbage (But Were Afraid to Ask)

Several folks, among them Edgar L. Munson (Springfield MO), have asked for help in deciphering Tournament Trail listings. So here's the scoop on all those enigmatic codes, abbreviations, and numbers.



If you can't play in the main tournament, you can play in a satellite tournament or the consolation event, but information about consolation tournaments is not included in Tournament Trail. Other information—for example, limited seating, if walk-ins are not accepted, minimum age limits—will be listed where appropriate. If you have any questions about a particular tournament, call or email the tournament director. For more information—and entry forms for many tournaments—visit cribbage.org.

The July CW asked for input from the 87.9% of ACC members who did not vote in 2007 BOD election. Apparently apathy is more widespread than anyone thought, for only three of the 6,203 nonvoting members responded. Here are their comments, followed by letters from two members who did vote.

I play every week in our club, where I am treasurer, and also play in the Reno tournaments. I believe that like many others who do not travel around to multiple matches I do not have sufficient knowledge of the people running, so my vote would be a shot in the dark. I know of no cure for this but feel my *guess* was better off not counted.

Mel Schuldt (Cotati CA)

I do not think I am a minority in not knowing those running. How fair would it be if I just picked names and voted for someone I do not know and take away a vote from someone more qualified? Would you rather have random votes for those that we do not know?

Alex Newton (Oak Bluffs MA)

I've been in the ACC since 2000 and have never voted . . . pick a reason: (1) It's a card game—as long as the BOD isn't crooked who cares; I always vote in real elections, those that affect my life. (2) Ninety percent of the ACC is 50+ and I'm 30—no one I would vote for would actually represent me. (3) You're not voting for just one person, you vote for 95% of people who run, so there's no good way to elect the one person you may like. (4) We vote for the board, not the president—no one ever asks us who should actually run the ACC, which is what matters. (5) In the seven years I've been in the ACC nothing has noticeably changed, which says to me no one on the board is doing anything worthwhile, so no need to vote for any of them.

I'm not sure why the voting percentage is so small but my take on it is that they trust the BOD no matter who is on the list. No need to vote if they think that way.

I believe that some members don't care for the candidates, and some think that you are suppose to vote for 25. If the membership could vote on some of the issues that concern us there would be more voters. I also believe in term limits. I believe that more members would run for the BOD if they did not have to compete against BOD members who are already established in their regions. I would suggest that after a BOD member has served three two-year terms they be replaced. Also, we don't need 25 BOD members, only four from each region would be significant, with an odd one like there is now. I am one of the few who has been voting from the very beginning.


