2011 GRNT Results

The 2011 Grass Roots National Tournament is complete! Directed by **Bob Joslin** (Lakeville MN), this year's GRNT had 2,003 official, 5 junior, and 130 unofficial players (an unofficial player is someone who played in more than one GRNT).

The top honor this year goes to Mike Henze (State Center IA), who scored a grand slam on his way to a very nice 34/16 +253 scorecard! Last year Mike's club—Club 17 in Des Moines IA—had the bad luck of having the most participants without a money winner, but Mike more than made up for it this year.

Other interesting GRNT tidbits:

- For the second year in a row, the Sea-Tac Peggers (Club 148 in Federal Way WA) had the most participants, with 68 (34 from Club 148 and 34 guests). Club director **Hal Lamon** is doing a great job promoting the grand game!
- Obie Weeks (Fallbrook CA), from Club 150 in Vista CA, scored two 28-hands.
- Russ and Catherine Perkins (Bear Creek NC) have been in a dogfight all year to see who would earn their Silver Award first. It came down to the GRNT: not only did Russ score an enviable 30/14 +130 while Cathy was suffering through a 6/3 –211 day, but now she'll have to listen to him brag about his Silver Award all summer long!

My Deal



Whining is built into the DNA of a cribbage player. Cut us, and we bleed whine-colored blood. For all I know, whining is written into the ACC's bylaws, for it certainly seems to be a prerequisite for ACC membership. (I once heard a rumor about a cribbage player who never whined, but it turns out that the story had a typo in it and was actually about cabbage.)

In any case, every cribbage player is entitled to one really, really good whining story, and so here's mine.

At Potawatomi Peggers Powwow (Stevensville MI) in mid-May, I had a lousy main, winning only ten games. In the consolation, however, I came alive and had 13 points after seven games.

In game eight **Alice Korn** (Round Lake Park IL) skunked me by 42 to capture top honors in last month's "I beat the CW editor by the most points" contest. And in game nine Master **Ethel Sherwan** (Oostburg WI) beat me by 22. I knew these losses cost me some side pool money and several qualifying places, but my 13/6 +47 was secure enough—right?

Only problem is, in the 30-player field (eight qualifiers), there were two 16s and five 14s, and Frosty's 13/6 +67 was ahead of me by 20 spread points. If Alice had skunked me by only 31 points, the 11-point swing from negative to positive points would have qualified me.

Aargh! I simply could not believe that I didn't qualify, and I spent the week in a cribbage funk.


One week later at That's A Go! (Mani-

towoc WI), I again had a lousy main and again won only ten games. This time, however, the consolation didn't go so smoothly.

I lost my first two games (Terry Weber [Madison WI] pegged out in game two from three away, leaving me with a worthless 17-hand). But I then started winning, including a monster skunk against my boss, Life Master (3 *) Bob Julian (Franklin WI), who almost qualified for the "I lost to the CW editor by the most points" contest in May.

Master **Beth Widener** (Green Bay WI)—whom I have never beaten—gave me my third loss in game seven, and in game eight Life Master (★) **Don Flesch** (Brookfield WI) pegged out from three holes away with the help of a cut Jack—giving me my fourth loss. I squeaked out a victory in game nine, turned in a lackluster 11/5 +25, and got ready to head for home.

But not so fast. The next thing I knew, someone told me that I had qualified! And not only did I qualify, but two 11s qualified below me, so I got a bye in the 36-continued on page 10

Cryptic Cribbage

I'm not new to cribbage but new to your organization. I am unfamiliar with many abbreviations and terms used in *Cribbage World*. Could you please add a section occasionally that defines abbreviations like MRP, GRP, GRRT, GRNT, and GRTOC or terms like Grass Roots and cribbage Master? What do numbers in parentheses like 33/16+197 mean? What do the numbers after names of Grass Roots members represent? Sorry to be so ignorant, but I would love to be able to explain these numbers to the people at the senior housing group where I live.

In order to save space, Cribbage World uses abbreviations and typographic conventions. Once you learn what they mean, they make perfect sense, but sometimes it's hard to crack the code. Generally a single parenthetical number after a member's name is the number of their Grass Roots club. A player's score is represented by three numbers. like this: 33/16 +197 or 12/6 -241. In each case the first number (33 or 12, in these examples) is the total number of game points (GPs) earned. The second number represents games won (16 or 6). And the final number is net points (+197 or -241). You can learn more about cribbage on the ACC's website: go to cribbage.org; first click on "Playing Tips" in the left column and then on "Learn to Talk Cribbage" in the right column. In the meantime, here's a short primer to get you started.

ACC	American Cribbage Congress—founded in 1979, the only sanctioning organization for tournament cribbage in North America
BOD	Board of Directors—25 ACC members elected to two-year terms who are responsible for the governance of the ACC
CW	Cribbage World—a monthly rag published for ACC members
EB	early bird—a nonsanctioned tournament held prior to the main event, typically on Friday afternoon or evening
GN	Grand National—the second largest sanctioned tournament each year, held on a rotating basis in one of the ACC's three regions
GP	game point(s)—the number of points awarded for winning a game: 2 for a win, and 3 for a skunk; losing a game earns you, not surprisingly, 0 GPs
GR	Grass Roots—a system of local clubs sanctioned by the ACC and playing nine games, typically weekly, although some clubs meet less often
GRNT	Grass Roots National Tournament—an 18-game tournament held in the fall of each year in all Grass Roots clubs throughout the entire ACC
GRP	Grass Roots point(s)—points earned at Grass Roots clubs; see the August 2007 CW, page 16, for an explanation of how GRPs are earned
GRRT	Grass Roots Regional Tournament—an 18-game tournament held in the spring of each year in all Grass Roots clubs throughout one of the Grass Roots regions
GRTOC	Grass Roots Tournament of Champions—an invitational tournament for club champions, held in conjunction with Grand National each year
HR	high rollers—any tournament with a higher than average entry fee
IRP	internet rating point(s)—points earned for internet play; see the September 2007 CW, page 24, for an explanation of how IRPs are earned

That's a Go! Tournament director Tina Wright catered lunch on Saturday, and there were requests for the recipe for her California Medley soup. (Warning: this makes a lot of soup!) Add 2 large cans of cream of celery soup, 1 small can of cheesy broccoli soup, and more milk if needed. Microwave 1 large bag of frozen mixed vegetables until just soft. Cut vegetables into small pieces and add to soup, along with ham or anything else you want to add. Simmer until hot, stirring regularly.

Nevada Triangle It pays to ride/ room together. What a confusing world we cribbage players inhabit! How can a 13/6 +47 not qualify one week, yet an 11/5 +25 gets a first-round bye the following week?! (Frosty helpfully suggested that I complain to the TD about my 11/5 qualifying!)

So what started out one week previously as my biggest whine (to date) ended up becoming a fantastic finish, as I ran through my three opponents with the help of some lucky cuts and won the tournament!

I'd like to think that my incredibly fortunate luck in qualifying in Manitowoc was a cosmic do-over to make up for not qualifying a week earlier. Both scores were aberrations in the cribbage universe, but with this second warping of the spacetime cribbage continuum, all became well again. The cribbage ship was sailing in the right direction.

Well there's more to this narrative than me simply exercising my constitutional right to whine. I'd like to turn this into an ACC-wide hunt for the best scorecards that didn't qualify in a sanctioned tournament.

Depending on whether they are a midweek or weekend tournament and on whether they are a main or consolation, sanctioned events can be 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 21, or 22 games long, and so we are looking for the highest nonqualifier in all eleven categories. Undoubtedly some nonqualifying beauties have been posted at past tourneys, but we can't revisit them, so we'll simply forge ahead from this point in time. I submit my Potawatomi scorecard as the current record holder in a nine-game tourney, but I expect this record to be broken soon—by someone other than me!

And while we're at it, we might as well also look for the lowest qualifying scorecards. For this, I submit the nine-game scorecard of Grand Master Lee Tesch (Green Bay WI), who was low qualifier at Manitowoc with 11/5 +16.

To verify either type of scorecard, please mail the actual scorecard (no photocopies, faxes, cell-phone pictures) to Cribbage World, P.O. Box 313, Ada MI 49301-0313. It will be returned to you if you really want a painful reminder of that day for your cribbage scrapbook. Of course, scorecards from Grass Roots, satellite tourneys, and other nonsanctioned events do not count.

Enjoy the hunt, and I look forward to hearing from many of you soon.





Over the past few years, I have been contacted by many ACC members with questions regarding cribbage boards. One question that has been asked several times is how to do lettering and numbers on boards. My suggestion is to use rub-on or stick-on lettering. Most good sta-

Each board that Jim makes is a unique piece of art that requires a large amount of time and effort. The wood is cut, shaped, sanded many times, cleaned, drilled, and finished. The drilling is difficult because of knots, grain, and hardness. The many coats of lacquer finish that can take months to dry. It is really an effort of love. Jim travels to many ACC tournaments with his boards. Anyone interested in his boards can reach Jim at 514.479.6135.

tionery and art stores carry both items. The letters and numbers are available in different styles, colors, and fonts. I prefer the rub-on letters because they are virtually flat on the board and can be covered with a clear finish for protection. For this system to work, the board needs to be finished to a texture no rougher

than a piece of news paper. This method can also be used to turn standard manufactured boards into tournament trophy boards.

The President's Column



When the newly elected Board of Directors meets this coming September in Reno, one of our first tasks will be the election of officers. These five officers constitute the ACC's Executive Committee: President, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Policy, Vice President of Operations, and Member-at-Large.

The term of office for the Executive Committee is one year, and they are to be elected by the Board of Directors at the ACC's annual meeting, which is held just before the Grand National tournament. No more than two officers can be elected from one region. The Executive Committee is empowered to act on all matters that cannot be reasonably deferred until the next meeting, with a \$5,000 limit on what they can approve for expenditures.

Their joint duties include approval of various committee heads, treasurer, and membership secretary and review of the Ethics Committee recommendations, as appropriate. Each Executive Committee member is individually responsible to assure that policies, directives, and operating manuals are complete and up to date for all areas that fall within their scope of obligation. Here is a listing of each officer's responsibilities:

President: chairperson of the Executive Committee, licensing agreements, trademarks and copyrights, recruitment, fundraising, awards, internet, public relations/publicity (marketing), youth, junior and education program, com-

pensation, Cribadier General program, establish agenda and chair the BOD meetings

- Executive Vice President: ethics, constitution and bylaws, parliamentarian, Grand National, JPW/ACC Open, Tournament of Champions, recording secretary, secretary general
- Vice President of Policy: archives and history, elections ballot committee, rules committee/director of research and development, judges program, testing examiner, senior judges, MRP system, nominating committees, Hall of Fame, BOD elections, annual election of officers, policy manual committee
- Vice President of Operations: restructuring, *Cribbage World*, statistician, membership secretary, treasurer, Grass Roots program
- Executive Member-at-Large: audit, forms management, tournament rules and guidelines, tournament commissioners, internet cribbage program

New Cribbage Cup Format

Beginning Wednesday, August 3, the Cribbage Cup will have a new format—a nine-game round-robin tourney on ecribbage.com. There is a limit of 96 players per tournament (imposed by the software). In order to accommodate players on both coasts, the start time will alternate between 8p ET and 11p ET.

Your ecribbage sign-in name (the one that you use with a password to enter ecribbage.com) is the name that must be used to play Cribbage Cup. If you use a nickname rather than your ecribbage sign-in name, you must re-register your ecribbage name as your sign-in name.


