BOD Election Results

he results of the 2013 election for the ACC's Board of Directors have been announced by ACC President Jeanne Hofbauer after being certified by Vice President of Policy Catherine Perkins. Just over one thousand ballots, representing 15% of the 6,658 ballots mailed to ACC members in April, were returned. This number constitutes a sharp downward turn after seeing higher participation in 2011 (17.7%).

One thing that did not change is that the Western Region again captured ten of the twenty-five available slots. The Central Region seated seven candidates (up one seat from the 2011 election), with the Eastern Region filling out the remaining eight BOD seats (down one from 2011).

Three current BOD members—Paul Barnes (Daytona Beach FL), Herschel Mack (Gold Hill OR), and Catherine Perkins (Bear Creek NC)—did not run for reelection, and two incumbents were defeated in their reelection bids. This opened up five slots on the BOD, and they were filled by five new directors who bring strong credentials to the BOD:

• Tom Cookman (Eureka CA) has a degree in accounting and spent his career in sales and marketing. He plans to focus on attracting and retaining new members. Tom has directed or codirected over twenty tournaments, directed his local Grass Roots Club, and serves as continued on page 10

My Deal by David Aiken



When the ACC's Vice President of Policy Catherine Perkins announced at the February 2013 BOD meeting in Reno NV that online voting would be available for this year's BOD election, I was ecstatic. What an easy way to get more members to participate in choosing the ACC's directors. What a great way to start bringing the ACC into the twenty-first century.

The good news is that 536 voters took advantage of the online voting system; the bad news is that only 465 voted by mail. So instead of voter participation increasing this year, it went down for the first time in three election cycles:

To be honest, I'm baffled as to why so many members failed to vote this year. I don't claim to have the answers, but here are some issues to think about.

The online voting process. Detailed instructions were printed in the April Cribbage World, but when the online voting process was set up, it didn't exactly match

these instructions. This is the BOD's fault and will need to be corrected the next time around. That 536 voters figured it out, however, tells me that this wasn't an insurmountable difficulty. I voted online and found it very easy.

Too easy? So, if it wasn't too hard, was it too easy? Some people like a little challenge in life, and perhaps they went with the mantra that if it doesn't cost anything then it's not worthy anything.

Alphanumeric code. To prevent members voting more than once, this year a unique alphanumeric code was assigned to each voter. Whether you voted online or by mail, you had to include the code. Did voters have trouble finding the code on their address label? What happened if their April Cribbage World got lost in the mail or was misplaced after it arrived? Were they disenfranchised by events like this?

Length of voting period. You wouldn't believe the number of people who said to me, "Two months! Who needs two months to decide who to vote for?" Would decreasing the voting period to one month put enough pressure on people to vote now instead of procrastinating—and then forgetting entirely?

- Richard "Frosty" Frost (Berlin WI) is a senior judge, a member of the Rules Committee, and codirector of the 2012 Grand National in Appleton WI. He plans to promote cribbage to the younger generation and the recently retired.
- Willie Evans (Richland WA) directed the first sanctioned ACC tournament in Washington after appearing before the Washington State Gambling Commission in 1985 and convincing it that cribbage tournaments should be allowed. He helped start Grass Roots Club 39 and since his retirement in 2003 has traveled to tournaments in all three regions.
- Bruce D. Sattler (Nottingham MD)
 plans to focus on dwindling tournament
 attendance and declining ACC member ship. He cofounded the Baltimore Grass
 Roots Club and has directed sanctioned
 tournaments for almost twenty years.
- Bill Medeiros (Winston Salem NC) previously served two terms on the BOD and directed two tourneys each year from 1995 to 2008.

There were two surprises in this election: the defeat of two incumbents—Fred White (Kailua HI) and Donald Brown (Long Beach CA)—and low turnout. Fred had served on the BOD for six years, while Don was first elected in 2009.

The low turnout is even more surprising in that the ACC offered online voting in a BOD election for the first time ever. Catherine Perkins reports that 536 of the 1,001 ballots were cast online (53.5%), but this number represents barely 8% of the eligible voters. Apparently apathy overruled convenience for the vast number of voters.

ACC policies regulating the composition of the BOD call for twenty-five atlarge members, with a minimum of six but no more than ten from each region. In addition, no state can have more than four BOD members.

The state limit prevented Julie Mack-Felkins (Woodland CA) from gaining a seat on the BOD, while the regional limit did in Fred White (Kailua HI). Julie garnered 409 votes and polled a very respectable #16, but because she was the

vacates their directorship.

Henry Bergeron (Webster NH) was the "high nonqualifier" in the Eastern Region, while first-time candidate Terry Weber (Madison WI) was the top unsuccessful candidate in the Central Region. Should a sitting BOD member from either of these regions vacate their directorship, Henry would be moved to active BOD service.

The newly elected BOD members will officially begin their duties on September 1, 2013, and serve until August 31, 2015. The new board will be installed at the BOD meeting held in conjunction with Grand National 32 in Atlanta GA on September 20. At that meeting the BOD will elect the five ACC officers from among the directors: president, executive vice president, vice president of policy, vice president of operations, and executive member at large. Online mistrust. Some people mistrust computers and anything that involves entering data online. Of course, absolutely no personal data was involved in the online voting, but maybe voters didn't get far enough to figure this out.

Apathy. Voter apathy is rampant—not just in the American political process, but seemingly in organizations like ours. I've heard many times that members don't care about the nuts and bolts of the ACC; all they want to do is play cribbage. Is this election their way of letting the BOD know this? But given the uproar about several practical issues in the last couple of years (the All American controversy springs to mind), I have trouble thinking that politics can't be a motivator.

One ballot per envelope. This year the ACC prohibited multiple ballots being mailed in the same envelope in order to prevent ballot stuffing. This seems logical, although I've heard people draw an analogy with proxy voting for corporate boards. For example, what if I didn't know any of the candidates running for office; would it be wrong for me to ask a player who travels all around the country to help me fill out my ballot and mail it for me?

As I said, I don't have the answers. It's very hard to tell what motivates people. There's no way to climb inside someone's head and see what they're thinking and how this influences their actions. So if you'd like to enlighten me, I'll be happy to take your concerns to the BOD.



May 2013 CBOM Follow-Up

In my May 2013 article, I featured a 350-year commemorative board honoring cribbage inventor **Sir John Suckling**. I obtained the board from **Dan Zeisler**, who directs the ACC Youth Cribbage Program. Neither Dan nor I knew any history on the board. So in my article I asked if any ACC members had any information on the board's origin.

A few days later, I received an email from **Andrew Mulhall Jr.** (Croton on Hudson NY). Andy has the same board and remembered that he ordered it from an old *Cribbage World* advertisement. Then, **Jeff Shimp** (Grand Haven MI), a founding member of the ACC, emailed me and said that **DeLynn Colvert** (Missoula MT) had made the board. Thanks to the wonderful ACC website, I was able to go to the *Cribbage World* archives and find the advertisement for the Sir John board on page 4 of the November 1985 CW. The ad was for the Sir John Suckling commemorative cribbage board and DeLynn's book *Play Winning Cribbage*—both of which were sold through Starr Studios in Missoula MT.

Now the mystery has come full circle. I emailed DeLynn, and he confirmed what Andy and Jeff told me. DeLynn made only about five of these boards, so Andy has a very rare board. Up until three years ago, DeLynn made all the

Master, Grand Master, and Life Master boards for ACC awards. He also made

many Formica boards for club and tournament use. In addition to making cribbage boards, De-Lynn authored and sold over 19,000 copies of *Play Winning Cribbage*. And most ACC members know that DeLynn was *Cribbage World* editor from 1990 to 2006.

The President's Column

I have been studying the nature of competitiveness for a while now. One of the most interesting things about the ACC is how we make such good friends among so many intense competitors. I would like to share the following bits of knowledge I have picked up.

One trait that ACC members exhibit is *competitiveness*. This trait has been identified in most living organisms as an innate survival mechanism. In biology, ecology, and sociology, competition is a contest for territory, resources, mates, social status, leadership, prestige, recognition, and awards. It is the opposite of cooperation!

Competition arises whenever at least two parties strive for a goal that cannot be shared or that is desired individually. Competition occurs naturally between living organisms that coexist in the same environment. (This is beginning to sound like a cribbage tournament!) For ages, humans have competed for necessities such as territory, food, mates, and so on, but when these needs are met, deep rivalries often arise over the pursuit of wealth, prestige, fame—and MRPs!

Competition can have both beneficial and detrimental effects. Positively, it serves as a form of recreation or a nonhostile challenge. Many biologists view competition as the driving force of adaptation and ultimately of evolution. (Is this why the game of cribbage has evolved since Sir John Suckling invented it?)

In humans, both cooperation and competition are considered learned behaviors, because the human species learns to adapt to environmental pressures. Consequently, we compete or cooperate on an as-needed basis. We can be aggressive, but we also possess a nurturing instinct. (This is why we can be competitors *and* friends!)



Summer is the time for change. Clubs should pound the pavement and shake the bushes for new members. There is no limitation on how many times new players can attend tournaments during the off-season, so take advantage of it. Encourage friends and family to play, and contact the people that you haven't seen in a while to invite them back.

The unofficial season provides an opportunity for players to evaluate their game strategy, identify weaknesses, and focus on solutions. Review your favorite cribbage book, visit the collection of playing tips on the ACC website, and for players who really want to step up to the plate, check out the Cribbage Forum website by Michael Schell (cribbageforum.com). Although it hasn't been updated recently, it is still an excellent resource for advanced cribbage strategy.

This is also an excellent opportunity for judges to review the ACC tournament rulebook and brush up on those less-common rule infractions. Use adhesive tabs to identify common infractions such as reneges (rule 7.3) and incorrect number of cards in hand or crib (rule 4.4). Remember, no matter how well you think you know the rulebook, always read the rule aloud from the latest rulebook so that both players involved understand the infraction and penalty imposed. Anyone interested in becoming a certified ACC judge should contact their club director or Al Miller (see page 3 for

ton SD. The hotel has locked in a room rate of \$81–\$99, based on room type, and a rate of \$20 for the awards banquet. The hotel has 121 rooms, with a Super 8 in the same parking lot. Kooistra has sponsors lined up to pay for trophies, printing, and lunch for the BOD meeting.

Executive VP (Schaefer): Todd asked for a list of committee, members, and chairs so he can update his list. No one has indicated interest in hosting GN 35 in the Eastern in 2016, so Eastern members should keep looking for possible locations. Schaefer said that we need to have a backup for Diane Waite as webmaster. J. Hofbauer said that Schaefer and Waite could find a suitable backup and they do not need to have BOD approval.

VP of Policy (Perkins): nothing new to report.

VP of Operations (Campbell): nothing new to report.

Member-at-Large (Shimp): nothing new to report.

At 4:20p, Perkins made a motion to adjourn; second by Aiken; motion joyously approved.

Next BOD meeting: Friday, September 20, 2013, at 9a in Sandy Springs GA.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING • FEBRUARY 7, 2013 SANDS REGENCY CASINO HOTEL • RENO NV

President Jeanne Hofbauer called the meeting to order at 9a. Directors present were Dave Aiken, Paul Barnes, Pat Barrett, Don Brown, Dave Campbell, Annett Eiffert, Charlie Finley, Roland Hall, Don Hannula, Jeanne Hofbauer, Roy Hofbauer, Ron Logan, Herschel Mack, Bob Milk, Dave O'Neil, Catherine Perkins, Larry Phifer, Todd Schaefer, Phyllis Schmidt, Peggy Shea, Jeff Shimp, Wayne Steinmetz, Valerie Sumner, and Keith Widener. Approved absence for Fred White.

The agenda was approved with additions, and the minutes of the September 21, 2012, BOD meeting were approved.

Old business: (1) J. Hofbauer showed the BOD the ring purchased for Joan Rein's Outstanding Meritorious Service award; she reported the cost of the ring was \$1,500 and it will be presented to Rein at the TOC tournament this weekend. (2) Sumner reported that the article she wrote regarding cell phone usage during tournament play ran in Cribbage World. It was decided to strongly suggest that players turn off or turn down their phones during play, and it is at the discretion of the tournament directors to urge the players to comply. (3) Eiffert is still in discussion about the copyright of the rulebook as Aiken said that the copyright is printed in our rulebook, but not filed. Aiken doesn't know if it is necessary to copyright Cribbage World. J. Hofbauer took a straw poll from the BOD to see if we would like to look into this matter further; it was agreed that this would be put to rest and no further action be required. (4) J. Hofbauer reported that Campbell has volunteered to be Larry Hassett's backup as membership secretary. There was some discussion about the cost involved to train a backup for the membership secretary and Cribbage World editor. Perkins said that currently the Executive Committee has the authority to approve expenses up to \$5,000, so there is no need to have a motion to approve. Hassett distributed a report about the software that he is currently using and said that he could easily bring his computer to a tournament and use that time to train Campbell and save expenses. R. Hofbauer said that he feels each position within the ACC should have a manual for training purposes. Hassett said he has put one together for his position. Aiken said that he currently does not have a backup and would like to run an ad for that position in the May and June CW issues. J. Hofbauer asked Aiken to put it together and run it by Executive Committee. (5) Eiffert said that the applications for the trademarks are still being reviewed.

Hall of Fame: Barrett reported that 98 of the 100 ballots were returned. No one was elected into the Hall of Fame this year. He asked that the BOD make sure that addresses of HOF panel members are current and to send him any updates prior to voting. He also said that he made an error by asking people to sign their security envelope but that will not happen again. We are still having some issues with nominations (too long or past the deadline). Hall brought up the number of people voted for on one ballot did not match the number written on the bottom of the ballot; that ballot was not considered valid and was not counted. Milk made a motion to amend rule 12.D.3 to include the wording: "If the numbers listed on the ballot do not agree, the ballot is invalid"; second by Barnes; motion approved.

ACC Policy & Procedures Manual: (1) Perkins distributed the new policy pages and explained how to up-

date the BOD manual. The following policies were either changed or amended: 4.F.2.j; 6.C.2; 6.C.3. Perkins said that we need to decide where we should add the rule regarding the limits of weekday tournaments. Aiken made a motion that we amend policy 6.D.4 to remove that line (#4) and insert "Weekday tournaments held in the same venue the week before and/or after a weekend tournament are limited to the Legacy Tournaments" into 6.D.3 and move the current policy 6.D.3 to 6.D.4.; second by Logan; motion approved. (2) Some BOD members feel that we are sanctioning too many tournaments, so J. Hofbauer asked Aiken to request input from the membership in Cribbage World so we could get their feelings regarding this issue. (3) We had discussion about moving Ohio from the Eastern to the Central Region. Perkins brought up that moving Ohio back to the Central Region makes sense since the players from Ohio traditionally play most of their tournaments in the Central Region. No Grass Roots clubs will be affected by the change. Shimp made a motion to move Ohio back to the Central Region; second by Logan; motion approved. (4) Perkins feels that too many instances players are "double dipping," where the same person can win both the consolation and the main tournament. Perkins made a motion that the final four players of a main tournament cannot enter the consolation tournament: second by O'Neil; motion not approved (8 ayes, 14 nays, 2 abstain). (5) Perkins reminded the BOD that the deadline to send in nominations for the BOD election is March 5. A copy of the April Cribbage World will be mailed to every member. This year multiple ballots cannot be mailed together. If a club or a member mails in more than one ballot in the same envelope they will not be counted. Online voting will available for everyone. Each person will be given a random alphanumeric number on their Cribbage World address line in red that they can use to vote online or on their paper ballot. If anyone tries to vote online and also send in a paper ballot, both ballots will be invalid. Perkins reported there is no charge for us to use this service this year other than the cost of an encrypted Cloud account, which is \$10 per month for approximately three or four months. Perkins said that with this alternative way to vote, we hope to increase our voting percentage from 18% last election. J. Hofbauer stressed that the instructions need to be very clear. Larry Hassett said 180 members are outside America and that he mails out Cribbage World to those members as soon as he receives them. Junior members will not be able to vote. Aiken asked that names of nominees be listed randomly in Cribbage World so as to not give anyone an advantage. There was discussion about other possible ways to list the names, but it was decided to continue listing the names in alphabetical order. (6) Perkins announced that this is her last term on the BOD and her last year running the National Open. J. Hofbauer thanked Perkins for her service and hard work, and the BOD gave her a round of applause and sincere appreciation.

New member information: Finley distributed information that he would like to have put on our website if the board approves. He is willing to help produce business cards and fliers for any and all clubs that provide him information about their Grass Roots Club. Schaefer said that Diane Waite could put a link online so Grass Roots directors can contact Finley.

New member retention: Hall is concerned about the ACC not retaining new members beyond their first year. He distributed copies of rules he would like to have put into play at the Grass Roots level. He shared that their club has grown in members and he contributes their success in the way they treat their new members. Hall has many great ideas and would like to see all clubs adapt the ideas. After discussion it was determined that this is not something the BOD can vote on until it goes to the Grass Roots Board of Volunteers first. Joan Rein said that she has reviewed some of the information and is in agreement that several of the things are a good way to teach a new player how to play the game, but she is concerned when a club may be deviating from the rules around how many weeks a new player can play without joining the ACC or the Grass Roots club. The BOD asked Hall to attend the Grass Roots meeting being held on Friday evening to discuss his ideas. Aiken asked Hall to submit an article to Cribbage World on what the Napa Grass Roots Club does to welcome their new members and different things they do to retain their members.

Payouts at Grand National side events: Mack brought up his concerns about payouts for Grand Nationals not being consistent. Barnes made a motion that all tournaments held during the Grand National use a 1-in-4 structure for main payouts (side pools exempt) effective immediately; second by Mack; motion approved.

New board member indoctrination: Brown thinks that BOD new members would benefit with indoctrination by the President and VP of Operations to help them understand how the BOD operates with the various positions and committees. Each new member would be told what is expected of them while serving on the BOD. The BOD said that this would be a good idea and that this could be discussed in the Executive Committee. Perkins said all new members receive a Policy Manual upon being voted onto the BOD. J. Hofbauer will take this to the Executive Committee for review.

Treasurer's report: Marlene Lazachek discussed the income statement, comparative balance sheet, and cash balance sheet; \$1,000 was advanced to Hannula for TOC expenses; \$1,500 was paid for Joan Rein's award. The ACC had a loss of \$14,269 for the first six months ending 12-31-2012, in large part because the Grass Roots Regional and National tournament income is received in the second half and the expense for the Grass Roots awards is in the first half of the year. The income in 2012 was \$19,000. Lazachek changed from MNI Bank to Chase Bank to save money. Campbell has been added as an alternate signer on the account. Lazachek discussed making a portfolio investment for the ACC with the \$75,000 capital in our account that has been sitting in a money market account. Chase Bank proposed a portfolio of investments. There was discussion whether we should invest and the amount to invest if we do. Some BOD members did not feel that we should take chances with the ACC's money: others felt safe with the proposed portfolio. Lazachek said that if part of the investment was withdrawn within the first year there would be a 1% penalty (after one year there is no penalty). A compromise was made to invest part of the money. Milk made a motion that we deposit \$50,000 into the portfolio; second by Widener; motion approved; J. Hofbauer requested the following info be included in the minutes: 20 ayes, 4 nays (Barnes, Mack, Eiffert, and R. Hofbauer). Shea made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report; second by J. Hofbauer; motion approved.

Membership Secretary: Larry Hassett distributed a report with data regarding ACC membership for 2012/2013. Our current membership is 6,604, and we are losing an average of 1,000 members each year. We have many new memberships each year; but many of them do not renew after the first year. Hassett has started sending out renewall notices via email, which has saved over \$780 in postage. He provided a breakdown of types of memberships and how many people are in each. He also provided an inventory of forms (value \$2,123) and equipment/software (\$795). J. Hofbauer asked that Hassett reorder more Cribbage Anyone? pamphlets as we are down to only 300 in inventory.

New MRP software: Larry Hassett distributed proposed policy additions and/or changes to the new software program. Proposals 1 (active membership) and 2 (processing of sanctioning requests) not approved. Proposal 3 (track suspensions): Perkins made a motion to include a program to track suspensions and notify tournament directors of any current suspensions a month before his/her tournament starts; second by Brown; motion approved. Proposal 4 (TOC invitations): Perkins made a motion to include a program to centralize the process of generating TOC invitation under the ACC national statistician; second by Shea; motion approved. Proposal 5 (ACC judges): Perkins made a motion to include ACC judges and senior judges; second by Milk; motion approved. Proposal 6 (current records): Aiken made a motion that the new software be capable to enter detailed information for each tournament; second by O'Neil; motion approved. It was determined that the new software would enter information from here forward, but we would not go back and enter detailed information for tournaments in the past. Proposal 7 (errors in current records): Perkins made a motion that the membership secretary correct obvious errors in the current MRP files; second by Aiken; motion approved. Phifer made a motion to accept proposals 8-12 regarding historic data before the 1997/98 season; second by Eiffert. There was discussion if this is a software issue or an issue of having people input the historical data. Perkins made an amendment to accept proposals 8-11; second by Finley; amendment to the motion passed. Perkins volunteered to help Hassett. Proposal 12 (final approval and release of the request for bid): J. Hofbauer feels that the approval of the bid should be by the entire BOD. Hassett will submit the bid to the "New Software Committee" to review prior to going to bid by April 30, 2013. The committee will make a proposal of how the BOD should proceed. This will be discussed again at the September BOD meeting.

New All Star proposal: Hall distributed detailed information regarding expanding the All Star team. Hall wants to expand the team to ten players from each region with the West having two teams, one from the Northwest and one from the Southwest. J. Hofbauer felt that this is the same proposal that we discussed at the previous meeting. Logan said that Hall followed the criteria required to bring it before the board, so we should hear his proposal. Hall pointed out that many players make the All American Team, but are not able to play on the All Star Team due to only taking the top eight players from each region. The suggested format does not allow a team member to play all the other team members from the other regions, but it would reduce the number of games and would allow the tournament to be shorted by about fifteen minutes. Some people felt that once you agree to have two teams from the West that you open the door to splitting the region. Shimp said he believes that the West does not have equality with respect to the number of people making the team given the number of ACC members in the West. Hall made a motion to expand the All Star team from 24 players to 40 players, starting August 1, 2013; second by Brown; motion not approved (10 ayes, 13 nays).

Committee Reports

Executive (J. Hofbauer): the agenda was posted online and not in Cribbage World due to deadlines. Additional expenses were \$89 for flowers sent to Bob Julian's funeral; \$1,500 for Joan Rein's ring; \$1,642 for 160 cribbage boards to promote the ACC to be placed in locations (RV parks, senior homes, clubs) that do not have a Grass Roots club; Rein produced the boards. It was suggested that we also include a deck of cards and a rulebook. If a BOD member wants to distribute some boards, see your tournament commissioner. Each person was asked to keep track of where they place these boards so we can have a record.

Ethics (Logan): the committee has been very busy and there were two suspensions in 2013 so far. Logan said that he will be putting an article in Cribbage World about ethical play and possible situations that may result in suspension. Logan said he will be putting his name and contact information in Cribbage World for people to contact him if they have any questions. Logan said that if anyone has any question or concern regarding ethical play or action of any member, they should write a letter and submit it to the committee and it will be investigated if the committee feels it is justified.

Grass Roots (Joan Rein): the GRRT is about 75% complete. We now have 186 active clubs. There have been many award certificates sent out: 196 28-hand certificates; 101 grand slam certificates; and 15 29-hand certificates. Rein said several Grass Roots Clubs are having problems with one or more of their members. Logan said that currently there is no approved procedure about how to handle these situations. Rein distributed a suggested procedure that she would like to provide to Grass Roots directors, but it was never approved by the BOD. There was discussion of several situations that cause questions and concerns about play and conduct during Grass Roots. Perkins made a motion to include the procedure for suspending a player in the Grass Roots manual; second by Barnes; motion approved.

Internet (Milk): there were 40 new participants and 13 of them won a weekly tournament. No changes in the schedule of weekly online tournaments. Milk reported that Rick Allen is his backup. One person suspended from online tournaments for leaving during play twice. Perkins asked that Milk update the internet manual. J. Hofbauer asked Milk to thank all the internet directors for their service and dedication to the tournaments.

Judges (Shimp) said that he appointed a new senior judge in the Western Region due to the number of players in West. He is considering bringing proposal to the BOD to add additional senior judges in the West. We are without a senior judge in Southern California. Currently each region has a maximum of eight senior judges. Shimp asked BOD members for recommendations for senior judge.

PR/Publicity (Norm Nikodym): J. Hofbauer reported that the budget for the Public Relations and Marketing Committee (PRMC) is set at \$4,000 for 2012/2013. J. Hofbauer asked Nikodym to put together a formal request for expenses and submit it for approval. Nikodym asked that each BOD member submit at least one name of a per-

son one would serve on the PRMC so we can grow our membership. Shea will send a copy of the article that is printed in the local paper to get new members. Nikodym will submit an article for *Cribbage World* suggesting members leave their old *Cribbage World* in places of business or clubs were others can read more about the ACC. Aiken said that *Cribbage World* is turning 400 with the June issue, and he is looking for ideas for ways to help the ACC celebrate the milestone event.

Rules (Steinmetz): the committee is considering changing the rule about too many cards in a player's hand. It is felt that the penalty is too severe for the nonoffender. Steinmetz clarified that when crosschecking scorecards if both players record the game as a win, both players receive a loss for the game. Clarification is also needed about a person saying "go" and claiming the game when they still have a card that could have been played. Steinmetz said that judges should not rule a renege when a person says go if the count is less than 22, as a go is not possible if the count is less than 22. The committee is considering the possible changes to these rules and will bring them to the BOD with suggestions for a future rulebook. Perkins said that if there are rule changes that are to be made prior to the printing of a new rulebook, it could be printed in Cribbage World so it could be cut out and pasted in the current rulebook.

Youth Program (Dan Zeisler): Mike Burns was recognized for his contributions to youth cribbage and will be presented with this year's award. Zeisler sends out teaching manuals and boards for anyone who requests information about youth play. He has a startup set that includes three cribbage boards and manuals. He sent out thirty sets of boards in 2012 and has already sent out three sets this year so far. There were five youth tournaments in 2012. This year will be the 20th annual Sierra Youth Cribbage Tournament. The Sands has donated eight T-shirts to the tournament. Zeisler shared an article that was in his local paper about the upcoming youth tournament. He suggested that each club hold an open house for new players to come and learn how to play cribbage or brush up on their game. Zeisler said there have been some guestions about youth participants receiving cash payouts in sanctioned play. Sumner read a July 1996 letter from the gaming commission that said youth participation in nongaming events such as cribbage is acceptable as long as it was held in a nongaming location such as a convention center. J. Hofbauer said ACC policy has been to give money to the guardian accompanying the youth. Zeisler thanked Mack for answering questions about rules.

Tournament Rules & Guidelines (R. Hofbauer): the Hawai'i cruise tournaments were well attended, averaging 86 players per tournament, and Campbell is now going to handle the sanctioning and reporting for all cruise tournaments.

Grand National 32 update: O'Neil said that the hotel's cribbage rate of \$95 is good for three days prior and three days after GN. The HOTEL is very close to many attractions and will provide free shuttle from the Atlanta airport, free parking, and free internet service. The free shuttle service can be used to travel within twp miles of the hotel. GN 32 shirts are available for purchase.

Grand National 33 update: Sumner said they are finalizing the schedule and committee heads. They have begun their fundraising through Grass Roots clubs in the Western Region.

Grand National 34 update: Scott Kooistra announced a midweek tourney Omaha NE prior to GN 34 in Yank-continued on page 39

Cribbage Stories from around the ACC

Pahrump Peggers Club 360 met at the home of Patty and Dennis Crooks to play our Grass Roots Regional Tournament. During one game, I have the pleasure of matching off against fellow club member Dino Bigagnoli. I win the deal and am happy to start the game with the slight advantage afforded by dealing first.

On the first hand, I keep 4-5-Q-K and am pleased to see a 5 cut for a 10-hand. Alas, Dino holds 4-4-5-6, and so the cut gives him a very nice 24-hand. With a twinkle in his eye, Dino politely comments, "Thank you for dealing first!"

Being just a bit deflated, I think to myself, "All is not lost." After all, we've all lost a game in which we scored a 24hand—right? On Dino's deal, I throw two innocuous cards to his crib and another 5 is cut. After our first pegging sequence, I'm left holding a single 5 and Dino leads a 5 from his remaining two cards. Fear strikes my heart. I have to pair his 5 for two points, and-sure enough-Dino comes back with the case 5 for 15-for-9! Even worse, Dino holds 5-5-6-7, so the 5-cut gives him a nice 17-hand. And those innocuous cards I discarded to Dino's crib? Shock prevents me from remembering them, but he comes away with a 12-crib. Ouch!

After one round of dealing, Dino is already sitting on third street in hole 68! Yup, this game is turning into a challenge.

Dealing my second time, I distribute

3-4-4-5 to Dino, and Dino cuts a 3 for a 20-hand! When he deals for his second time, Dino holds 6-7-8-9 and cuts—you guessed it—into a 16-hand!

After four hands, Dino is sitting in hole 110, while I'm shaking in my boots in hole 57. I'm able to peg to hole 60, but needing only 11 holes to win, Dino keeps J-Q-Q-K on his fifth hand—and cuts a Jack for 16!

He wins the game in five hands—with plenty of room to spare. From my perspective, it's not like I lost due to bad cards. After all, I went 60 holes in four hands—above the average of 52 that I would expect. But I proved to be no match for Dino in this game!

Dino is one of the true gentlemen of cribbage, and I truly enjoy playing him, but I'll approach our next game with a bit less self-confidence!
