CALL FOR BOD NOMINATIONS

This year is once again the biannual election for the ACC's Board of Directors. BOD members will be elected for a two-year term beginning September 1, 2015, and ending August 31, 2017. The BOD meets twice each year—on the day before both the rotating Grand National tournament and the TOC in Reno NV—to handle the administrative and financial business of the organization.

Any current ACC member in good standing at least eighteen years of age can submit the paperwork to run for the board. (If you want another member to run for the BOD, please contact them directly and encourage them to file the paperwork.) At least six but no more than ten members shall be elected to the BOD from each region. No more than four members shall be elected from one state.

Candidates must submit a letter stating that they wish to run for the BOD. The letter must include the candidate's name (indicate how you want it printed on the ballot), ACC number, address, phone number, and email address. Candidates should include with their letter of intent both a short biography (200 words maximum) and a picture for publication in *Cribbage World*.

Letters must be received by March 5, 2015. The preferred method of submitting letters and biographies is to send email to the nominating committee at cathypnc@embarqmail.com with a Word document

My Deal

by David Aiken



Play smart, play fair, play fast.

Because of work schedule and lengthy travel time to many tournaments, I don't play a lot of satellite events. But when I get the chance, I like to play the Friday night satellite before the main tourney.

I've noticed, however, that more and more tournaments are using what is called "open seating" for satellites. We are not, however, playing kitchen table cribbage at these events, and so whenever an entry fee is required, random seating is the only option that makes sense. Open seating violates ACC policy, as unanimously approved by the BOD and published in the March 2008 *Cribbage World*:

One of the tournament directors' jobs is to work toward the goal of random seating. But given the nature of many tournaments, truly random seating is virtually impossible. Exceptions for good cause shall be made to the random seating goal.

Exceptions for good cause in seating at tournaments include, but are not limited to, adherence to "The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990." A wide set of methods in seating the players may be used by tournament

directors to best deal with the variety of on-site conditions that they will encounter when running a tournament, as long as they don't grossly violate the goal of random seating.

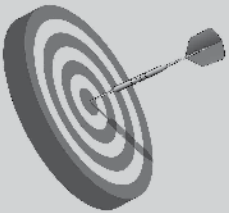
Gross violations of the goal of random seating include, but are not limited to, allowing a player to select a seat to avoid playing a specific group* of other players, allowing players to look at numbers when drawing for seats, and having odd and even numbered containers when drawing for seats.

(*A group is defined as a unit of two or more.)"

The rationale for this policy is that when prize money or points are on the line, players should not be allowed to select which other players they play—or do not play. But open seating does exactly that; in fact, you could put your scorecard on a table, go out for a drink, and come back and move to another table that is perceived to have easier players.

Notice also that this policy statement does *not* make an exception for satellite events. Read at face value, every tournament—main, consolation, Friday night,

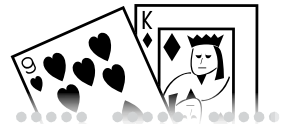

Tourney Tidbits

Hot Betty! At the Thanksgiving double-header in Grand Rapids MI, just as the finals of the second consolation were starting, the players had to evacuate the building because of a fire in the hotel. The two finalists—**Betty Briggs** (Charlotte MI) and **Mary Bearss** (Wyoming MI)—and a TD went to a nearby deli for the final match. Fortunately, no one was hurt, the hotel did *not* burn down, and no cribbage boards were lost in the conflagration. In the meantime, Betty won the consolation—her second win in three weekends!

Out-Gruber-ing Gruber! **Ellen Kutz** (Milwaukee WI) discovered an easy three-step way to beat Life Master (2★) **Jerry Gruber** (Minneapolis MN) in the qualifying round of the Jingle Bell Open main in Marinette WI. *Step 1:* when sitting in hole

111 miscount your 9-point hand (3-4-5-Q suited, with an unsuited 9 cut) as 10 points and peg into the game hole instead of hole 120. *Step 2:* sit by embarrassedly as Jerry calls for judges and they apply the “false claim of game rule,” leaving you in hole 105 after backing up 1 hole for overpegging and 15 more holes for falsely claiming the victory. *Step 3:* turn over your crib (6-7-8-9, with a 9 cut) and count 16 points to give you the victory anyway!

Saturday night, doubles, high roller—must use random seating.

No TD would dare use open seating for sanctioned tournaments (i.e., the main or consolation), so why would anyone think this is a good option for satellite events?

I suspect that open seating is used to save time or effort, but it is very easy to implement random seating. At smaller tournaments, simply shuffle the scorecards (face down, of course) and distribute them randomly on the tables, calling out players’ names much like many Grass Roots clubs do at their weekly tourneys. At larger

tournaments, use poker chips or playing card jokers, prepared beforehand with the seat numbers, for players to draw their seat assignments from.

I encourage all TDs to immediately abandon open seating as an option for satellites. Any BOD members or ACC officers present at a tournament that uses open seating should talk to the TD and let them know that this violates ACC policy. And the three regional tournament commissioners should let TDs know that open seating will not be allowed at any tournaments. **CW**

Cribbage Meetup

I read the editorial in the December *Cribbage World* about attracting new members to Grass Roots clubs.

I belong to Club 24 In Tempe AZ. A few months ago I started a Meetup event for cribbage in Tempe, which meets every Monday evening from 6p to 9p at Paradise Bakery on the corner of McClintock and Guadalupe. Paradise Bakery is happy to have our business on Monday evenings; some of us buy sandwiches and soft drinks but it is not a requirement to play cribbage with us. We have had from four to seven players on any given Monday evening. Signs explain that we are a cribbage event, and very often other customers stop by to see what we are all about, eventually joining us at a later date.

I purchased sixteen tournament boards from a supplier listed in *Cribbage World* and obtained playing cards from Costco. Club 24 has gotten a half dozen new people from this event.

A Meetup event is started by going to **meetup.com**, a nationwide site that has existed since 2001. The website is self-explanatory and very simple to use. Meetup

groups pay about \$150 a year for membership. Our Monday event is also on two other Meetup pages—Cribbage University and Just Cards—neither of which charge.

My cribbage event is social cribbage, and we teach also. It is surprising how many cribbage players are out there and just don't know where to go to play cribbage. Personally, I had never heard of the ACC or Grass Roots clubs until I went to a Meetup cribbage event in Phoenix last April. I have played cribbage all my adult life and just wanted to find other cribbage players.

In this computer age, this is a good way to reach people. I do not require they sign up first; they are welcome to just show up to play. We have many winter visitors to Arizona, and people from as far away as London, England, have joined us to play cribbage while they are in town.

Meetup is a great way to advertise our cribbage event, and it is a lot of fun for all of us. I encourage other clubs to start Meetup events or groups in their areas. It is so simple and not as formal as the Grass Roots clubs but can encourage and inform people about the ACC and the Grass Roots clubs, eventually increasing the ACC membership.

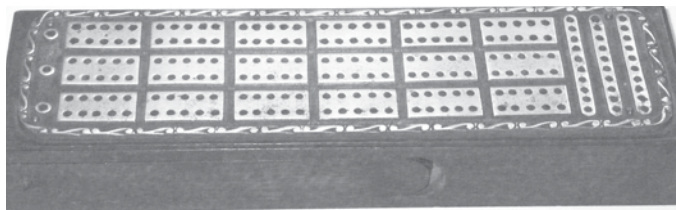


Who was that masked cribbage player?

Cribbage Board of the Month

It has been awhile since I have featured one of the older boards from my collection. This early 1900s board is one of my favorites. There is also a mystery as to exactly who manufactured this board.



Here is what I know about this metal-on-wood three-player board. I first saw a photo of it in **Bette Bemis's** book *Cribbage Boards, 1863–1998*. Those of you who are board collectors should have this book (available on amazon.com). Bette was the founder of the Cribbage Board Collectors Society (CBCS). Until she passed away a few years ago, she provided corrections and updates to CBCS members. In her book, this board was shown as an unidentified model made by the C. W. LeCount Co. of South Norwalk CT.

CBCS member **Peter Leach**, a LeCount cribbage board expert, self-published *C. W. LeCount's Cribbage Boards* in 2001 in a limited edi-

tion of only sixty copies. In his book, he identified this cribbage board as the “Leader Cribbage Board.” Peter found the board illustrated in an early 1900s “drop ship” catalog published by J. A. Tyrholm & Company (New Richland and Woldorf MN). The catalog listed the board for \$1.00 and noted that it would be shipped from Omaha NE.

This “Leader” board is beautifully made, and I think it is as nice as any LeCount board. In addition to the very nice metal work, it has stepped wooden molding around the top of the board. It also has a perfectly fitted wood slide cover that opens for card and peg storage.

The mystery still remains: where was this board manufactured, and who made it? If any ACC members have information, please contact me.

Finally, I want to thank Peter Leach for all his time and research and for providing one of his rare books to me. **CW**

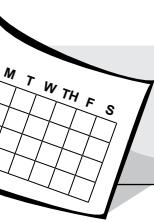
