- 1. 188 clubs hosted a total of 6,234 local tournaments (average: 33.2 tourneys per club).
- 2. 4,812 players played a total of 89,971 sessions.
- 3. Average sessions played per player: 18.7.
- 4. Average attendance at a local club: 14.4 players per session.
- 5. Players earned points 25,118 times (27.9% of the time).
- 6. Best card this season: 23/9 +258—by Martha Bryant (Punta Gorda FL).
- 7. Worst card this season: 0/0 -272.
- 8. 180 players played all 36 club weeks (not counting travelers).
- 9. Most local tournaments by one player: 134—by Ralph Turco (Tacoma WA).\*
- 10. 195 players played 37+ times as a member/visitor or traveler.
- 11. 3,134 players played only as a member, and 482 players played as both a member and visitor. So ~13.3% of players play in other clubs as visitors.

#### Play smart, play fair, play fast.

I enjoy travel—seeing parts of this country I haven't seen before, or revisiting the same cool places again. And I like the opportunity to see old friends and make new ones.

I just returned from a 5,500-mile, 26-day excursion to the Pacific Northwest. The primary reason for the trip was my nephew's high school graduation in Wenatchee WA and a family reunion in Monroe WA. I also spent two days with Jay and Lois Fulwider in West Seattle. Jay is a longtime member of Club 148 and writes Cribbage Board of the Month. As it turned out, Mike (dealer) held A-2-3-J all Diamonds, and so both players had identical flushes (except for suit) for 18 count! Not only is this a pretty rare hand, but the odds of both players having it at the same time must be phenomenally small!

New Illinois Open Only two 28-hands showed all weekend, and both were in the playoffs—Life Master (2\*) Rob Medeiros (Dorchester MA) held a 28 while playing Life Master (4\*) Wayne Steinmetz (Hartland WI) in the main semis, and Grand Master Dan Selke (Arlington Heights IL) had a 28 versus Grand Master Clay Collier (Beatrice NE) in the consolation final. Dan had made Grand Master just minutes earlier by topping Collier's traveling partner, Master Don Thienel (Omaha NE), in the semis.

Jack Shumate's story about Stan Wilson was so interesting, if I did not already know Stan, I would be trying to find a way to meet him! Likewise, Bill Jones and the story about his service to our country being recognized. I especially encourage others members to write, as Ira Deutsch did, with personal stories about their own ACC experiences. And our editor did a great job in showcasing new Grand Master Haley Hintze so we can see her as more than just a formidable opponent across a cribbage board!

Also noted are the "25 years ago in the ACC," where we can see past glories, and "In Memory of Cribbage Friends," where we recognize the loss of our friends and fellow competitors.

But one of the things that really resonated with me was the letter from new member Scott Lee, titled "Frustration." As our editor wrote, this particular issue is an easy fix, we just need to remember to explain our particular cribbage "jargon" from time to time, and new members need to know that there are many resources to ask how things work, what things mean, and how to access help. But a thought occurred to me: Could this be an example of why we have a problem with retention of new members?

Entering a new group or new society

can be intimidating. Remember your first day of school? Well, probably not, but you get my drift! How about your first day on a new job? We need to facilitate the concept of "belonging" with new members. They need to feel they are accepted because they have an interest in playing cribbage. This is why they have come to us, this is our point of commonality. We need to make them feel they are welcome and wanted.

The need to belong is what drives humans to participate in social activities such as sports, clubs, religious groups, and community organizations. We have an emotional need to affiliate with and be accepted by members of a group. We need to have not just acquaintance, but acceptance, attention, and support from fellow members, as well as the acknowledgment that we can give those attributes back to others in the group.

I know that this concept works, it worked with me. Our first contact with the ACC was at a Grass Roots club in Portland OR in 1985. We were greeted by a fellow named **John Hardy**. I will never forget his warmth and interest in having us participate. Even though John moved to Colorado years ago, he is still a good friend. We were fortunate to enjoy some time with him

recently as he was visiting friends and family in Oregon.

## Cribbage Board of the Month

The featured board this month was sent to me by ACC member Jerry Burgess (FL-1467) of Lake Wales FL. Jerry plays with the Haines City Grass Roots Club. He

found this board at a yard sale and after reading over instructions. the he felt it was quite unusual. It appears to be a standard board with some extra holes. It could be used for playing a standard game, but is designed by Thomas Stauff to be, according to him, a modernized, updated, scientific version of the old game of cribbage.

Stauff felt that "American cribbage" needed to be changed from the

old, stuffy English style. He came up with a variation to the old game that he called "500 Cribbage Thomas System." In his introduction to the game, he writes that the old rules were written by "Englishmen writing


to Englishmen, about an old English game. But times have changed, the game has changed [note: he is speaking of the original five-card game changing to six cards] and the

rules most certainly

should have been changed accordingly. . . . Like hoop skirts and bustles they have long since served their day and now represent just pages in ancient history." He goes on to say, "We have therefore taken over 'unpolished this gem,' have ground down its surface inequalities and polished its facets to enable it to take its rightful place as the Crown-jewel of all card games."

This 500 Crib-

bage board was made 1982 by "500" Cribbage Inc. of Van Nuys CA. However, the rules and introduction were copy-

righted in 1939. I don't know when the first boards manufacwere tured. I am quessing it was in the early 60s because the "500 Cribbage" logo was trademarked 2-2-1960. The trademark has expired along with the continued manufacturing of this convoluted version of cribbage.

Just a few more notes, and I will put 500 Cribbage

back on the shelf (where it belongs). First, the rules are twenty-eight pages long, and the game incorporates American poker with cribbage. Because of that, a point value of 15 is given to a straight flush. Therefore 3-4-5-6-7 all Spades is worth 15-4

plus 15 points for the straight flush, for a total of 19. Really?!

Thank you, Jerry, for a very interesting addition to my collection. I will be taking it to the Cribbage Board Collectors Convention this September in Denver.

It is sometimes important to out-wait our opponents during pegging sequences. You are nondealer with 2-5-J-Q. The dealer plays an Ace on your 2 lead. What do you do? It's easy to just play a picture card and avoid potential trouble, but is that the right play? Many times the dealer plays a low card to induce you to play a picture, so why fall into the trap? Play the 5 and don't be surprised if dealer plays a J or Q, which you happily match—a big four-point swing that could be a factor in the eventual outcome of the game.



The Grass Root National Tournament is complete. There were 2,035 players, and all the results have been compiled by statistician Bob Joslin! To see the full results, go to accgrassroots.org and click on the "Results" link at the top of the page. San Diego Club 79 took the most money out of the prize fund mostly due to the huge 37/16 card that Steven Stanley posted. His stellar day won him a nice payout and Grass Roots bragging rights for a year. Thirty-four players posted 30-point scorecards or better. There were eight grand slams (first nine or last nine games), fourteen 28-hands, and two perfect 29-hands, held by Lawrence Switala of Arizona Roadrunners Club 24 and the previously mentioned Steven Stanley.
