My Deal by David Aiken



Play smart, play fair, play fast.

Like every card game, cribbage has little quirks that don't make sense from a purely logical standpoint. Why, for example, does the Jack merit special preference? Why is a four-card flush allowed in the hand, but all five cards must match in order for the crib to count as a flush?

Here is another cribbage mystery that is not as well known. The 29-board was in-

vented in 1953 by Edward M. Hirst, a woodworker living in Burnaby, British Columbia. The mystery is that this board apparently *never* features the 5 of Clubs as the cut card.

Bette Bemis, who wrote the definitive book about board collecting (*Cribbage Boards*) says: "The variations, which are minor, include the suit of the cut card used by the various companies. The diamond, heart and spade have been used, but not the 5 of clubs" (pages 17–18).

There are actually two issues at play here. First, how does Bemis know the 5 of Clubs is not used? And, second, why is it not used?

As helpful as Bemis's book is in many areas, her statement is, unfortunately, an "argument from silence." Just because she had never seen the 5 of Clubs on a 29-board does not mean it is nonexistent. In fact, the only way to state categorically that the 5 of Clubs is not used on this board design is to examine every 29-board

ever made—which is a physical impossibility.

Even if Bemis's statement were true, the question becomes: *why* is it true? What did the 5 of Clubs do to get exiled from the

29-board? I consulted some experts from the Cribbage Board Collecting Society, and the most plausible reason we could think of is that the Clubs design may be harder to create by hand (the original Hirst boards were all handmade), but isn't Spades just as difficult to draw by hand? And the boards have been produced commercially since 1962, so this reason surely should not be problematic, especially now continued on page 9

Just about everything that can possibly be said about Duane has already been said, so Cribbage World hired some private investigators to snoop around and dig up some dirt on Duane, and here is what they discovered. Duane played accordion in polka bands for many years (including at his sister's wedding). He also played trombone in high school band. BOD

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

This year is once again the biannual election for the ACC's Board of Directors. BOD members will be elected for a two-year term beginning September 1, 2017, and ending August 31, 2019. The BOD meets twice each year—on the day before both the rotating Grand National tournament and the TOC in Reno NV—to handle the administrative and financial business of the organization.

Any current ACC member in good standing at least eighteen years of age can submit the paperwork to run for the board. (If you want another member to run for the BOD, please contact them directly and encourage them to file the paperwork.) At least six but no more than ten members shall be elected to the BOD from each region. No more than four members shall be elected from one state.

Candidates must submit a letter stating that they wish to run for the BOD. The letter must include the candidate's name (indicate how you want it printed on the ballot), ACC number, address, phone number, and email address. Candidates should include with their letter of intent both a short biography (200 words maximum) and a picture for publication in *Cribbage World*.

Letters must be received by March 6, 2017. The preferred method of submitting letters and biographies is to send email to the nominating committee at **cathypnc@embarqmail.com** with a

Word document attached. If you do not have email, send the letter to

The preferred format for pictures is digital. Send a photo of yourself via email to **cribbage@iserv.net** (do *not* send photos to Cathy Perkins). Photos (head shot only) should be in sharp focus with no distractions in the background. Pictures taken on flip phones are not acceptable; photos taken with a smart phone must be submitted in high resolution. If you do not have a digital image, mail a photo to *Cribbage World* at PO Box 313, Ada MI 49301.

Ballots and biographies will be printed in the April *Cribbage World*. To be eligible to vote, members must be at least eighteen years old, have current membership at the time the ballots are mailed, and have a valid mailing address. Joint members who normally get only one CW will get two in April. And members who normally read *Cribbage World* online will receive a paper copy in April.

Online voting will be available again this year, or paper ballots may be mailed, with a postmark of no later than May 31, 2017. Candidates will be notified by the ACC president after the results have been certified by the VP of Policy. The official results will be published in the July *Cribbage World*. CW



Years Ago in the ACC

The cover of the February 1992 *Cribbage World* announced that **Ray Hanes** (Walla Walla WA) won the Portland Winter Open by beating **Willie Evans** (Richland WA) in the finals—and in the process earning the 103rd Master Award. Today the ACC has 938 Masters.

Elsewhere we read that **Jack Howsare** (Virginia Beach VA) won the Fayetteville Cribbage Classic and that **Albert N. Miller** (Nashua NH)—then and still the ACC's judge testing examiner—earned

the fifteen Grand Master Award (we are currently at GM #402).



The ABCs of the ACC

ACC members earn points in three separate divisions: sanctioned tournaments, Grass Roots, and internet play. Each division has its own set of points:

- MRPs, or Master Rating Points, are earned at weekend tournaments.
- GRPs, or Grass Roots Points, are earned at clubs.
- IRPs, or Internet Rating Points, are earned in internet tourneys.

These three point systems are totally separate. The points are *never* added together. (Think of it as three separate buckets, one for each system.)

A fourth system was established last year for youth players: Youth Rating Points are earned at weekend tournaments by players aged eighteen and under. YRPs may be converted to MRPs when a youth player turns nineteen. CW

TOC Seating & Rotation

The TOC on March 3 will use what has come to be called the "TOC system of rotation." For those who are new to the TOC, as well as for those of us who are forgetful, here is the #1 thing you need to know about how this system works: players on both sides of the table move but stay on their side of the table.

There are two additional elements of this system that the tournament directors will implement:

- An odd number of players must move on each side of the table, and this number will be at least 17 in the TOC.
- Anchors will be at opposites ends on opposite sides of the table. There needn't be the same number of anchors on both sides, just so long as there is an odd number of players moving on both sides.

If the tournament directors designate you as a captain/anchor/stationary seat, please do not move. Nothing messes up a good rotation faster than a "moving anchor." CW



t is nice when our only decision is whether to toss 9-Q or 9-K into the dealer's crib. But if the 9 matches the suit of the King, while the 9 and Queen are nonsuited, which combo

should you throw? Life Master (2★) Elmer "Ras" Rasmussen (Chehalis WA) recently addressed this issue on Cribbage Hand of the Day (dailycribbagehand.org). Here is what he had to say.

"Suited discard as compared to unsuited discard of the same ranks has a value of .04 points greater. A crib flush occurs once in each 740 deals. On average, that's one crib flush in every 81 games played. Changing discard combination to avoid suited discards is a losing proposition. Suited 10-K still has a lower average than unsuited 9-K. Suited 9-K still has a lower average than unsuited 9-Q. Granted, if you have the choice of suited or unsuited discards of same rank, put the suited to your crib and the unsuited in the opponent's crib." CW

End-of-game situations sometimes require creative pegging. You have first count needing 12 and hold 2-3-4-9. After the King cut, how do you proceed? The dealer is 10 out so you aren't really worried about him pegging out. Under normal circumstances you would lead the safe 3 and probably peg 2 or 3 holes, but that won't help you here. Instead, lead the 9 and try to trap the dealer's little cards later on. If he makes it 19, play your 3 to make it 22. That gives you the opportunity to trap either a 2 or a 5. If he matches your 3, play your 4 and hope for the go and 31-for-5. Think a little out of the box, and you might steal a few wins!


